



THE PRESIDENT'S LETTER

Hi Neighbors,

It's time once again for another update on neighborhood activities,

but as we're all working our way thru a mild winter and preparing for an active Spring, I thought it might be a bit more interesting to highlight a few fun facts about the neighborhood. As part of this rundown, I'd like to request that each of you help add to what we know about Forest Hills by sharing your wisdom about a given house, location, or other interesting nuggets of neighborhood lore.

Some of these points have been documented in archives, others shared via oral tradition, so feel free to comment on their validity:

- •Renowned surveyor Warren Angus Ferris is the neighborhood's official patriarch having surveyed large parts of the Nacogdoches County up to Dallas/White Rock Creek area and having been ceded a 640 acre plot to homestead back in 1845 Ferris Farm
- •The Warren Angus Ferris cemetery located at the corner of St. Francis and San Leandro is noted to have been the site of over 100 burials (1846-1906)
- •In April 1924, Leon L. Fechenbach, dedicated the plat of the Forest Hills Addition, six miles from the city limits of Dallas
- •The Forest Hills Company operated by H.W Brouse was the exclusive agent responsible for the development of our neighborhood starting back in the early 1920's
- •Forest Hills was officially annexed by the City of Dallas in 1945
- •West of San Rafael approaching the spillway waters, Forest Hills used to have a gravel pit /quarry bordering it
- •During the 1920's, various Forest Hills roads that existed were common locations for bootlegger meet ups with San Rafael specifically has been mentioned on multiple occasions. (I think our FH Security patrol likely existed back then too and did their job to keep the neighborhood safe!)

I hope to hear more from you on our neighborhood history and as we make new history, Please share your stories with our editor so we can include them in future issues. And as always, if you have time to volunteer and help support neighborhood activities with your time and dues, we look forward to your assistance.





Immerse yourself in beauty and art this spring at the Dallas Arboretum. Start by channeling your inner hippie at Dallas Blooms where this year's theme "Peace, Love and Flower Power' aptly describes the breathtaking, annual bulb festival. Dallas Blooms is the largest floral festival in the Southwest and runs through April 9, 2017.

Beginning April 15 through July 31, ZimSculpt will feature exquisite sculptures by several dozen Zimbabwean artists. These sculptures, known as

Shona art, are carved from enormous semi-precious stones and are available for sale or commission. You will

be able to find artist Aron Kapembeza demonstrating the art in the Pecan Grove live and spend a few minutes marveling at his use of chisels, hammers, sand paper and files to shape these unique sculptures. Artscape will also be held April 29-30 in the garden. Artist tents will feature the work of 103 artists from across the country on a variety of mediums including painting, sculpture, mixed media, photography and more for display and sale. 




















Spring officially starts this month!

With the new season, it's time to go over some springtime reminders to help your pets' health and happiness!

Easter Treats

The Easter bunny is great! He leaves all kinds of goodies and treats for our kids and pets. Be sure the Easter bunny only leaves behind pet-friendly items for your four-legged children. Keep the chocolate goodies and all lilies up and away from pets' reach.

Traveling

It's time for Spring Break! It's always nice to get away and have your pets join the ride. Keep your pets safely secured in a car with a crate or a pet-approved seat belt (available at pet stores). Some dogs like to have the wind in their face while riding, but try to avoid this as debris from the road or other vehicles can get in their eyes and face. If you plan on taking a trip on an airplane with your pet, contact your veterinarian as soon as travel arrangements are made to double check all documentation that might be needed.

Cleaning

Out with the old and in with the new! Spring-cleaning time is here. While we tidy up our homes, be sure that all cleaners and chemicals are put away from curious noses. Read the label and follow all instructions for proper use and storage. If your pet happens to get into cléaning products, contact the Pet Poison Help line at 855-764-7661.

Just like humans, pets can suffer from allergies too! Allergic reactions in pets can cause sniffling, sneezing, itching, and swelling of the affected area. Be sure to have your veterinarian's phone number ready if you notice any of these signs!

April showers bring May flowers... and bugs! It is important to have your pets on year-round flea and heartworm prevention! Our seasons in Texas can be sporadic so help your pets out by purchasing a monthly flea and heartworm prevention from your veterinarian. If you have any questions about which type is the best for your specific pet, contact your veterinarian.


