FRI / FHNA Introductory Column

Hi neighbors! I'm happy to begin this new recurring column to update our neighborhood on relevant news right outside our back door – the Ferguson Rd. corridor. Linda and I have supported the Ferguson Road Initiative (FRI) www.fergusonroad.org for years, but a few years ago, I got more personally involved during a heightened period of activity focusing on the long-planned White Rock Hills Community Recreation Center project. After a while, I became more immersed and joined the Board of this non-profit.

I realize that some of our neighborhood is already well aware of FRI, while others are not – as such, I'll take a bit of an introductory angle here.

The mission of FRI is to engage and empower a community of advocates to advance a safe, beautiful, prosperous and proud community.

For a small volunteer-based organization, it's managed to have a notable

impact over the years, through effective advocacy, communication, connection, facilitation, coordination, partnering, lobbying, leadership and requesting funds.

Earlier this month there was a well-attended celebration for the 20th anniversary of FRI, which was founded by Vikki Martin. In addition to the nearly 200 attendees, community leaders and elected officials in attendance included; Mayor Mike Rawlings, Police Chief U. Renee Hall, Councilman Mark Clayton, State Rep. Eric Johnson, County Commissioner Theresa Daniels, Eastfield College Presidents, past and present, among others.

The next major milestone in FRI's list of accomplishments is the groundbreaking of the new White Rock Hills Park, located near the corner of Highland and Ferguson (2229 Highland Road). Here, the City of Dallas, in partnership with the Ferguson Road Initiative, broke ground on the park, Phase I of the future White Rock Hills Community Recreation Center (CENTER) project. FRI has long lobbied, advocated, coordinated and even helped design the forthcoming park. Phase I of the park is expected to be completed in 2019.

FRI highlights from the last twenty years of working together for the greater good in Far East Dallas:

- Working with 4 Dallas mayors, 5 city managers, 9 councilpersons and 5 Dallas police chiefs,
 Growing from 5 to 37 neighborhoods, homeowner associations, and crime watch and VIP programs,
- •Receiving \$2.5MM in federal funding from the Department of Justice to fight crime (2000-2011),
- •Establishing 1 new park, 1 skate park and 1 spray ground,
- •Tearing down 1 crime magnet motel in 2005, demolished 3 crime and gang-ridden apartments,
- •Helping reduce overall crime in target areas within the Ferguson Road Initiative boundary by 40%,

•Advocating with White Rock East, to build a new \$10MM wing to address overcrowding at G.W. Truett Elementary School, •Serving 10,868 families with free income tax preparation services over 14 years, keeping \$19MM in our community via the VITA program

•Building the \$8.5MM White Rock Hills Library in 2012 through the city bond program; 287,016 library items checked out over the past year,

•Recruiting 3,658 volunteers who have donated 90,033 hours of service to FRI at a combined value of \$2,173,396,

•Publishing 31 free editions of "FRIdays" neighborhood news magazine and 240 "NewsFlash" e-newsletters,

- •Facilitating \$245MM in quality economic development, in the form of affordable, middle and high income housing and retail,
- •Providing 85 FRI Community Connection Town Hall & Weed & Seed Steering Committee meetings,
- •Collecting 2,800 bags of trash in 11 Operation Beautification Litter Cleanup Events,
- •Forging partnership with White Rock United Methodist Church to plan the community outreach for Owenwood Farm and Neighbor Space
- •Participating in countless hours of meetings, hearings, E-Mails and phone calls to the City of Dallas, elected and appointed officials, as well as City staff

Additional upcoming developments that FRI advocates for are expected to include the later phases of the park development that will include the CENTER, the redevelopment and improvements of Highland Road, interconnection to the city trail system, intersection improvements at Lakeland, and perhaps most importantly a growing partnership with the Owenwood Farm and Neighbor Space

ALLURE OF THE ARBORETUM

You probably already know the Dallas Arboretum and Botanical Garden hosts the Southwest's largest floral festival each spring, Dallas Blooms. And common sense tells us there must be a lot of hard work that goes in behind the scenes to make such a magnificent display of flowers happen. But, did you know that more than 50,000 spring bulbs are laid out and planted throughout the 66-acre garden? This undertaking, one of the city's dirtiest jobs, takes 65 Arboretum staff members roughly 11,560 man hours to complete. The horticulture team must amend the soil, remove existing plants, compost, broadcast bone meal bulb fertilizer by hand, and add blood meal to deter rodents and birds. Only then are the beds ready for the bulbs to be planted in staggered rows from three to six inches apart. The final step is upkeep of the beds - well, that and the addition of approximately 100,000 pansies, violas, and other spring-blooming annuals and perennials to enhance the bulbs and enchant the eyes. So when you visit the garden for Dallas Blooms between February 23 and April 7 this year, take a moment to reflect on this picture of the hard-

working horticulturists and the painstaking planting process that made the magic happen. Tickets for Dallas Blooms are available online or at the gate.

Tickets are already being sold for the 2019 Cool Thursdays Concert Series at the Arboretum. Think spring! Go ahead and secure your tickets to Dallas' only outdoor concert series overlooking White Rock Lake on the gorgeous Martin Rutchik Concert Stage and Lawn. With a fantastic lineup of tribute bands homage to artists from George Strait to Michael Jackson and original bands from the Beach Boys to Journey, you are sure to find a concert that suits your musical sensibilities. The spring series runs from March 28 - June 27, and the fall series runs from September 5 - October 24. Visit www.dallasarboretum.org for the full lineup and to purchase tickets.

2019 Is Here!

And it's a great time to start a resolution to keep your pets healthy! Ringing in the New Year should be a time of celebration - not emergency clinic trips! Follow these simple steps to keep the start of your New Year stress free!

Valentine's Day is all about the chocolate for us but not for your pets. Keep all chocolate and candy up and away from curious noses. Typically, chocolate is most toxic when it is darker and in solid form. If your pet happens to ingest chocolate, call Poison Control immediately. In addition to chocolate, keep all sugar-free items away from pets as well. Xylitol, an artificial sweetener found in many types of sugar-free candies and baked goods, is toxic to dogs and can cause liver failure. Like any holiday, keep all decorations out of the way of pets so ingestion is not a possibility.

And always be sure they have an appropriate collar on with up-to-date information tags AND have been microchipped - it's the law!
