Easter Treats

The Easter bunny is great! He leaves all kinds of goodies and treats for our kids and pets. Be sure the Easter bunny only leaves behind pet-friendly items for your four-legged children. Keep the chocolate goodies and all lilies up and away from pets' reach.

Traveling

It's time for Spring Break! It's always nice to get away and have your pets join the ride. Keep your pets safely secured in a car with a crate or a pet-approved seat belt (available at pet stores). Some dogs like to have the wind in their face while riding, but try to avoid this as debris from the road or other vehicles can get in their eyes and face. If you plan on taking a trip on an airplane with your pet, contact your veterinarian as soon as travel arrangements are made to double check all documentation that might be needed.

Cleaning

Out with the old and in with the new! Spring-cleaning time is here. While we tidy up our homes, be sure that all cleaners and chemicals are put away from curious noses. Read the label and follow all instructions for proper use and storage. If your pet happens to get into cleaning products, contact the **Pet Poison Help line at 855-764-7661**.

Allergies

Just like humans, pets can suffer from allergies too! Allergic reactions in pets can cause sniffling, sneezing, itching, and swelling of the affected area. Be sure to have your veterinarian's phone number ready if you notice any of these signs!

Fleas

April showers bring May flowers... and bugs! It is important to have your pets on year-round flea and heartworm prevention! Our seasons in Texas can be sporadic so help your pets out by purchasing a monthly flea and heartworm prevention from your veterinarian. If you have any questions about which type is the best for your specific pet, contact your veterinarian.

HOW SOON CAN ITEMS GO OUT?

- Dallas Sanitation Services picks up brush and bulk trash once per month. Items must be set out
- By 7 am on the MONDAY of your collection week.
- But not earlier than the Thursday before your collection week.
- WHAT GOES IN?
- Furniture * • Trim Limbs Appliances*
- Shrubbery
- Carpet* Bagged Leaves Mattresses*
- Other bulky items*

*Separate bulk items from brush, limbs and leaves

RECYCLE!

• Think about items you can cut up and recycle before putting them at the curb. (cardboard boxes, plastic, paper.)

WHAT DOES NOT GO OUT?

- Grass clippings ***
 Construction debris * Bricks, concrete, rocks, dirt**
- *To dispose of construction debris call 311 to request Cost Plus Service.
- **Bricks, concrete, rocks and dirt should be taken to McCommas Bluff Landfill for disposal.
- *** Grass clippings should be mulched back into your lawn or added to your home compost pile.

WHERE?

Put materials on curb in front of your home.

NOT on medians or vacant lots.

NOT in the street or protruding out into the street from the curb. This presents a traffic hazard! * *You can be fined for putting trash out at the wrong time AND in the wrong place.



New city ordinance: Tethering and Confinement

Tethering

All animals, including cats, must be confined at all times. This means that any animal must be restrained at all times in a fenced yard, in an enclosed pen or structure, or by a hand-held leash if in the custody of the owner unless the cat(s) belong to a Trap, Neuter and Release program.

Reference: 7-4.7 Dallas City Code

Effective February 1, 2018:

An owner of a dog may only tether a dog if the dog is in the owner's immediate possession and accompanied by the owner, as required by City Code, Section 7-3.1. In addition, the owner of a tethered dog shall:

- (1) not allow the dog to be tethered in any manner or by any method that allows the dog to become entangled or injured;
- (2) use a properly fitted harness or collar that is specifically designed for the dog; and
- (3) attach the tethering device to the dog's harness or collar and not directly to the dog's neck.

Confinement

Dogs that are kept outdoors require an area that is at least 150 sq ft. for each dog six (6) months of age or older. The confining structure must be constructed with materials that will not allow the dog to escape, but still provide access to its doghouse, a building or shelter.

The doghouse, building or shelter must provide protection from the elements, allow adequate room for movement and must be structurally sound.



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A new year is all about resolutions – so why not include your pet in your resolution this year? The SPCA of Texas recommends: -



Be sure your pet is up to date on all vaccinations this year.

-Be sure your pet has proper identification and consider microchipping your pet at a local clinic for a more secure form of identification.

-Get your pet tested for heartworms and have them on prevention year-round.

-Have your pet spayed or neutered to prevent overpopulation.

-Consider making extra time to take your pet on a walk or having time to play with your pet indoors. Both dogs and cats will love the extra attention. -Give your pets a little extra love this Valentine's Day. Offer your dog or cat a special treat that they will enjoy and be sure to keep all the chocolate away from curious noses.

-Our pets are like family and they should be reminded of that! The beginning of a new year is the perfect time to make a promise to your pet that you will keep them safe, healthy and happy for the rest of their lives.

D U M P I N G ... Remember, it ALL Drains to our Lakes and Rivers Storm drains and roadside ditches lead to our lakes and rivers. So, any oil, pet waste, leaves, grass clippings or dirty water from washing your car that enters a storm drain gets into our lakes and rivers without being treated. We all need to be aware. How can you help? SIMPLE: SWEEP IT. Do you have extra fertilizer, grass clippings, or dirt on your driveway or sidewalk? Sweep it back onto your lawn. Hosing your driveway sends these pollutants into storm drains that lead directly to our lakes and rivers. KEEP IT CLEAN. Whether in the street or in your yard, remember to keep leaves, grass clippings, trash, and fertilizers away from storm drains. ONLY RAIN IN THE DRAIN. Never dump motor oil, chemicals, pet waste, dirty or soapy water, or anything else down the storm drain. All of these materials pollute our lakes and rivers!


