Family Roots Run Deep in Forest Hills

Forest Hills Block Captain, Vicki Burns has been connected to Forest Hills her whole life. Family roots go even deeper with her ancestors arriving here in 1865, when Forest Hills was just a thicket with a farm belonging to our first resident, Warren Ferris.

In 1865, Vicki's great-great grandfather, William (Bill) Rupard (1829-1910) and his wife Sarah Jane Fisher Rupard (1831-1917) came here in a wagon train from Kentucky with the Fishers and Rupard families, who settled where Buckner Children's Home is now at Buckner/Hwy 30. While operating the Beeman's Grist Mill on White Rock Creek, Bill Rupard bought John Neely Bryan's cabin. The owner of the mill was John Beeman, whose daughter, Margaret was married to Bryan. After the Civil War, the Bryan family had moved the historic one-room

cabin, which had been the first Dallas post office in 1843, to farmland near the Beeman's White Rock Mill. The Rupards lived in the cabin for many years and eventually moved the cabin onto the Buckner Children's Home property, where within its walls Rev. Buckner and the directors knelt and dedicated the new Orphan Home in September 1880. It is the same cabin that you can see today in Dealy Plaza, downtown.

Bill's daughter, Virginia Rupard (1867-1945) was born in that cabin, on land near the mill, which later would be the DeGolyer Estate (1939), where the Arboretum is today. Later in her life, she would tell tales of her childhood, seeing the notorious outlaw, Belle Starr riding along with her sidekicks to hide out in Ferris Thicket (Forest Hills) and of seeing panthers on their late night buggy rides home through the

thicket. As a young child she might have been in that crowd of 7,000 at the East Dallas depot, July 16, 1872 to see the celebrated arrival of the railroad, Houston & Texas Central (Southern Pacific).

In 1881, Vicki's great grandfather, John Tom Frank (1860-1936) from Kentucky arrived in Dallas at the age of 21. Early in his life he worked on a farm near Garland, then called Duck Creek and at a dairy farm North of Dallas owned by W. W. Caruth. He married Virginia Rupard in 1890 and their only child, Charles William (Buck) was born in 1895 on the family farm where Ferguson and Highland are today.

In the early 1900's, John Tom built a small house for his family on 5 acres at the edge of Ferris Thicket (Forest Hills), where San Rafael between Garland and Highland are now. White Rock Creek flowed (many times overflowed) behind them. Hwy. 78/Garland Rd., the narrow dirt/gravel road was called the Central National Highway of the Republic of Texas (1844).

In 1911 when White Rock Lake was built for a more dependable water source to Dallas, 51 year old John Tom Frank saw an opportunity with Dallas residents coming out for day outings in the countryside to fish, picnic and duck hunt.

He gave part of his land for widening the road (Garland Rd.) and built a food stand and bait house next to their house where he sold hamburgers and beer. He sold bait to the fisherman, rented out bicycles and boats. It is said he put the first boat on White Rock Lake in 1917 with the fisherman referring to the dock on Garland Rd. as "Frank Pier". Their address became 7229 Forest Hills Rd. (not San Rafael as it is now) in 1924, when Ferris Thicket was developed into the new Forest Hills Addition. That concession stand remained in operation for 25 years until it closed in 1933.

When Vicki's great grandmother Virginia died in 1945, she still did not have electricity, was using kerosene lamps and was heating her iron on a wood-burning stove. "Blankety Blank" electricity will kill you!", she'd say. She was buried in the Cox Cemetery by the lake, filled with other prominent pioneer families like the McCommas, Williamsons, Ledbetters & Fishers. (Fisher Road was named after her uncle Thomas.) The cemetery is also said to be the resting place of a young lady that the legendary ghost story, "The Lady of the Lake" was based.

Vicki's grandfather, Buck Frank received the Purple Heart when wounded as a machine-gunner with the 19th division in France's Argonne Forest. The World War I veteran returned home, helped at the food stand and later worked at the Dallas County Tax Assessors. Buck built a little house next door to his parents for his new wife, Hattie Toler in 1930 and went on to become the Dallas Commissioner for District 2 from 1937-1948.

Frank's daughter/Vicki's mother, Charlene grew up with the new Forest Hills neighborhood at her doorstep. She caught her first fish, a black bass, in White Rock Creek at 6. All throughout her school years, the

neighborhood was filled with children. The triangle at San Rafael and Forest Hills was where they played endless hours of sandlot baseball. Summer brought swimming and picnicking at White Rock's bathhouse and Saturdays, the movies at Lakewood or Casa Linda.

When Vicki's mom and dad married in the 50's, they moved a stone's throw away, up the hill from the home place, into a small duplex in the first block of San

Fernando, where a new house stands today at 8129. This was Vicki's home until she was 4, when they moved to Mesquite and later to a new housing development, off St. Francis near I-30, adjacent to the old White Rock Airport. Vicki went to Bayles Elementary, J.L. Long Middle School and Skyline High

In 1984, that original 5 acre family property

with the houses, the 1917-built red barn, a smoke house, hen house and large garden were sold by Vicki's grandmother, Hattie Frank, as was an adjoining parcel by its owner to make way for "Highland on the Creek".

Flip the calendar forward from then to 2005. Vicki and her husband, living at Cedar Creek Lake, planned to move to Dallas. Since Larry was raised on Cambria, he favored Lakewood. Vicki with her family ties and fond teenage memories had her eyes on Forest Hills. One day, Larry got a tip about a house for sale on Santa Clara. You can imagine Vicki's delight when they drove up and discovered it was her best friend's house. The very house at which she had spent endless, happy hours! Vicki had come home. The rest is history!

Weatherizing Homes For The Texas Heat

Do we really need to talk about this now? Yes, if you want to be prepared for the hot summer months that we are about to face. We know that certain things must be winterized during the cold months, such as a home or a boat. But there is less talk about being prepared for the summer. Why? After all, we have almost twice as many hot months in Texas as we do cold months. To the average homeowner, weatherizing your home will provide the most benefit with the least expense. Here is a list of suggestions you can do in preparation for the summer that will make life easier on the environment and your bank account.

- Check outlets and plugs on outside walls to ensure they have gaskets. If there are no gaskets, you can purchase them at a hardware store for pennies.
- Look for areas where pipes and vents enter and exit the home. The holes are usually cut larger than needed. These are found under sinks, behind toilets, and in water heater closets. Once located, fill with expanding foam insulation to fill any gaps and voids.
- Weatherstrip all exterior doors and windows that open. Gaps around windows and doors are the largest culprit of air infiltration. Make sure you purchase a good premium window and door caulking. You will need to remove the old caulking and clean the area first before starting.
- Make sure the fireplace damper is closed tightly when a fire is not burning.
- Change the filter in your HVAC unit and call a technician to evaluate the system. There are internal factors
 within the unit that can cause it to run less efficiently. You can also do a lot yourself by simply taking
 temperature readings from different parts of the house. If they are not all within a couple of degrees of each
 other, you might have a problem.
- Seal loose or leaky ducts. We see this a lot when performing our energy inspections. It is as common to find the attic being air conditioned as it is a living room. Additionally, seal all other holes between your attic and crawlspace where air could leak in.
- Proper insulation, ventilation, and radiant barrier will help your home maintain a comfortable and consistent temperature throughout the year, thereby reducing the work load of your heating and cooling system. Here are a few hints:
- A home should have a minimum of 12 inches of insulation above the ceiling.
- Proper ventilation will allow air flow to keep the attic as cool as possible. Make sure you have adequate intake and exhaust vents for your home.
- Radiant barriers are more effective in hot climates than in cool climates. It will help prevent the transfer of heat through the roof, thereby reducing the temperature of your attic.

Whether you decide to do it yourself or pay someone to do it for you, weatherization pays off. Take the time and spend the little money it will cost to weatherize your home before the scorching summer months arrive. It won't take you long to see the results in your home and in your pocket.

SECURITY ALERT — BACK TO BASICS



There is a criminal or several cruising our neighborhood right now, looking for crimes of opportunity through unlocked home/vehicle doors and windows. Don't give them what they want!

Our patrol officers and undercover are also working our neighborhood. They are calling on you, the eyes, ears and memories of our residents to help in this endeavor.

Frustrate thieves by depriving them of their greatest asset, a quick and easy entry and improve you odds of not being a victim. There was a time, not so long ago, when homeowners did not feel the need to lock their homes/cars or turn on an alarm. Come to think of it, many still neglect to do this! This is the most basic security measure you can take to protect your premises.

We are distracted in our busy worlds, rushing to work, getting kids to school or trying to do three things at once. When you leave your home even for a short time, (Recently a homeowner was robbed while only away for

30 mins), get into the habit of taking time to check and <u>double check</u> that everything is secure. Lock that door and turn the alarm on. You cannot make your home or yourself crime proof, but you can make it crime resistant.

Be aware of everything when leaving your home. If you see something suspicious take the time to circle the block and come back for a moment. And of course, call 911 with descriptions and details. An alert and involved community is a criminal's nemesis. It is often reason enough for them to try business elsewhere.

HOMELAND SECURITY – WE ARE LISTENING

There was enough favorable response to the "Do you still want the Security Program" alert that was sent out recently, that the Security board with an advisory group of residents (11 in total), met January 30 to discuss the future growth and continued service to the Forest Hills Neighborhood. Losing this extra patrol would be costly. \$20 a month (it could be less if more participated) is very little for the value that the program brings.

Using comments and suggestions of the residents, research is underway for offering more convenient ways to make pledges and for informing residents of their payment status each quarter. PayPal will be activated in April for those wishing to pledge online and status statements will be sent quarterly to residents in the near future.

The Great Forest Hills Kitten Rescue of 2011!

While walking through the Forest Hills woods the morning after the severe ice storm that froze all of Dallas, San Fernando resident's Laura Russell and her mother, Sharon, heard what sounded like a bird calling from high above. Looking up, they saw not a bird but a kitten perched some 50 feet in the air in a tree, pleading desperately for help, obviously wet and nearly frozen. Although the temperature was well below freezing and there was a brisk wind, Laura removed her snow boots and, with a boost up from her mom, climbed fifteen feet up and called to the kitten which responded by inching down to a crotch in the tree about forty feet up. But it would go no further. So Laura came down and her mother climbed up. But the kitten would not come down.

Now it should be pointed out that Laura and her mother were not alone. Laura's father, Leon Russell, and her twin brother, Charlie, stood bravely at the base of the tree, offering manly encouragement to both Laura and her mother when they climbed up. But when it became clear that this was not going to be successful, Leon and neighbor Vicki Squires, who had now joined the rescue attempt, procured a fifteen foot ladder from the Squires garage. The kitten, apparently, was not impressed enough with the height of the ladder to want to risk climbing down any further. The two barking dogs at the base of the tree MIGHT have had something to do with the kitten's reluctance.

So Leon and Laura returned in grandma's pickup with a 32-foot extension ladder which neighbor David Anderson helped extend and place against the tree. Did I mention that the tree was swaying in the high winds? Did I mention that the ladder was fully extended? Did I also mention that the tree and the ladder were about five feet from a power line?

While the growing group of would-be rescuers waited and watched, Leon gave detailed instructions and engaged in all manner of elaborate preparation before ascending the ladder (i.e. yes, he was stalling!). But with his children watching expectantly, he knew that what he had to do. Up he went, slowly, rung by rung until, amazingly, about three quarters of the way up the ladder, the kitten began to work its way down to the top of the ladder! Climbing up a few more rungs and reaching out the last few feet, the frozen kitten was plucked from the tree and tucked safely away inside his coat for the descent. Its tail was frozen literally as stiff as a board and its fur was coated with ice.

At the Russell home, the white and brown kitten was warmed, dried, fed, and appeared to recover quickly from what must have been a terrible nightime ordeal in the tree during the ice storm. Later that evening, the Strong family posts on Animal Alert! that they have lost a kitten. The Russell family checks Animal Alert! The description given sounds remarkably like the new kitten that Laura now thinks is interested in listening to her iPod. A late night phone call is made. The owner is found.

Anne Marie Strong is 4 1/2 years old. She and her little brother received a pair of sister kittens as a gift this past Christmas, but this kitten roamed and became lost several days earlier. How it survived the owls and the coyotes, several days without food, and the night in the tree in the freezing rain and ice storm is a wonder. That this kitten was re-united with its owner is not, however, such a wonder because the Forest Hills / Little Forest Hills Animal Alert! System worked exactly as it is supposed to. As a thank you, the Strong family made a donation to Animal Alert! Anne Marie and her little brother also wrote a very kind letter to Laura and Charlie, inside of which was \$50.00. On their own, Laura and Charlie donated their reward to Animal Alert!

Oh! I almost forgot. The rescued kitten's name is . . . (drum roll, please!) . . . Snowflake!
