DREDGING IN WHITE ROCK LAKE

On January 28, Dallas Park and Recreation hosted a public meeting to discuss the White Rock Lake Dredging Feasibility Study, a project that our District 9 Council Member Paula Blackmon has been spearheading since her election in 2019. The consulting/engineering firm of Freese Nichols was retained by the City to perform the study. At the meeting, the consultants used an interactive presentation to solicit feedback from the approximately 75 or so attendees from neighboring communities. Freese Nichols asked questions such as the types of activities that are done at the lake, concerns of the attendees with respect to the project (e.g., cost, noise, water quality, wildlife impact, disturbances to lake activities and trail uses), and priorities for desired outcome (improving water quality, shoreline maintenance, long-term lake maintenance). The likely method that will be used in the dredging project is hydraulic dredging, which uses a "cutter suction head pump" which pulls out a mix of 90% water/10% sediment. A key to the project is the return of the water to the lake, while capturing and removing the sediment. The participants at the meeting were overwhelmingly in favor of a dredging project, although there is much information yet to compile and studies to be conducted.

The next step will be to complete the analysis in February/March (evaluate methods, alternatives, risk factors, regulations and costs), research funding sources, requirements and timelines in April, hold further community meetings to report findings and gather input, and in May 2020 provide final feasibility study report. The rough timeline from there is that work would commence in late 2021, with a completion in fall of 2022.

Our long-term residents will remember the lake was last dredged in 1998. The last study that preceded that dredging was in 1994, which should give an idea about the time that may take between completion of the feasibility study and completion of the project. In the 1998 dredging, approximately 3,000,000 cubic yards of sediment were removed from the lake. There was a fortunate coincidence at that time – a landowner in Hutchins, Texas needed his gravel pit filled at that time. A dredge boat pumped sediment from the bottom of the lake through 24-inch pipes for the 10-mile journey directly into the pit for 9 months. This time around, there is no immediate repository for the sediment, although there's some time to locate one.

Annual White Rock East Garden Tour-Save the Date!





YARD OF THE MONTH



January - Lee Ann & Marshall Hunt 8258 San Fernando Way

Lee Ann and Marshall Hunt have created a slice of the Hill Country with their sprawling "German Texas Farmhouse". The acre-plus landscape reflects their

passion for art and western aesthetic.

A modern post and rail fencing, softened by Pink Muhly Grass and Wax Myrtles, defines the yard. Ornamental Cabbages and colorful Pansies flank entrances and corners. Thirty-six new trees have been added to the existing canopy and four raised beds provide seasonal color. Extensive foundation plantings include flowering perennials like native Hibiscus, Dutch Iris and Floribunda Roses because Lee Ann loves flowers - "Wisteria is one of my most favorite things," already planted and awaiting the future arbor that will frame the front walk.

In the largest raised bed, celebrating Marshall's Native American heritage, is "Peaceful Journey", an imposing bronze by Santa Fe artist Bruce LaFountain. The bronze mailbox installation is by Marianne Caroselli. Titled "A Letter from Grandmother," it depicts two gleeful children reading a letter. The most whimsical piece, "Sunday Ride" by Allen Wynn, rides among Crepe Myrtles in the side yard, to honor our White Rock Lake cycling lifestyle.



February - Michael Ferguson 8417 Santa Clara Drive

When it came time to move his young family into a home with a safe, large private yard, Michael, a native East Dallas boy looked to Forest Hills and built his dream home in "...a

modern Santa Barbara style, with a red tile roof, arched doorways, a fountain out front..." He trusted

Randy Hardin to design a garden that would feel lush, like the California coastal landscapes he admired. Randy added dimension to the front by extending planting beds into the yard and filling them with perennials of different heights and textures. The richly varied space moves the eye across and through a landscape framed by two young Live Oak trees at the street and a trio of Red Oak, Japanese Maple and Texas Mountain Laurel by the driveway. As you walk up the drive, you discover a river stone and cement block path nestled between lush beds. Encore Azaleas and Indian Hawthorns are interspersed with less-expected perennials like Agaves, Yuccas, Blue Fescue and Kaleidoscope Abelia.

The fabulous backyard has room for Michael to throw the football with his boys or just relax around the pool with cascading waterfall, the fire pit, under the poolside pergola or on the covered patio. On May 17th come feast your eyes when this garden will be on the White Rock Lake East Garden Tour.



FRI/FHNA SAVE THE DATE AND GET INVOLVED!



- Stephanie Beckham of Dallas Aerial Surveys and colleague Ryan Johnson will capture UAV imagery to link to the FWFC website, for a fly-through video.
- A new bat house is being completed by Jerry Chenault with installation shortly.

and respect for our men and women in blue. When asked what he found most interesting, Lanham Bevers replied, "He is just like us and everyone liked him."


