

This is a volunteer service to both Forest Hills and Little Forest Hills (whose main volunteer is Maeleska Fletes). Volunteers 1) respond to calls about lost pets by looking for them, and also returning loose animals they find to their owners, even if they have not been alerted; 2) assist owners with emotional and practical issues when their pets pass away; 3) help get medical attention to hurt animals; 4) solicit donations from pet stores and veterinarians when needed; 5) find homes for pets when needed, for example cat litters; 6) assist senior or unemployed residents with pet food donations. In a 3-month period, over 30 issues were handled.

This keeps us coordinated with the activities and needs of our wonderful Forest Hills Security Program. The FHSP currently has 58% neighborhood participation, and along with separate donations, this allows for 55 hrs per week of patrol. Our crime rate has been reduced by 50% for serious crimes from 2017, when patrol hours were at 28 hrs/week, to the present, where patrol hours are now 55 hrs/week. More patrols do = Less Crime! This year the Forest Hills is Brewing fundraiser will be an online auction event on Friday October 16, 2020. All proceeds will go to the Security Program to fund the extra hours we need for Holiday patrol from Thanksgiving to January. The Forest Hills Security Program is a separate organization from the Forest Hills Neighborhood Association and both are vital to our neighborhood. Construction Update:

The construction continues in full swing with Alex Sanger Preparatory School adding 23 new classrooms, computer and science labs, a dance studio, and a middle school gym. The dual language school will serve pre-K through 8th grade students. The principal hopes Sanger will soon qualify to become an international baccalaureate school, TAG school or STEM school. Once construction is completed in January, Sanger will have a new façade, additional parking spaces, a fire lane and all the portables will be removed.

Our Opportunity to Make a Difference in Extraordinary Times

When I moved to Forest Hills six years ago, one of the things that struck me was the contrast between the beauty and prestige of our neighborhood and the elementary school in its midst. How lovely, I thought, that we have a little neighborhood school inside our Forest Hills bubble. But I learned quickly, by the signs in my neighbor's yards, that almost everyone sent their children outside the neighborhood to private schools, many of them miles away. Once I began volunteering at the school, I understood why. Even though Sanger Elementary is situated on the Forest Hills "side of the tracks," almost all of its students come from the apartments off of Ferguson road, on the "other side of the tracks."

When school starts this month, whether virtual or in person, more than 75% of the children who learn to read and write in Forest Hills will come from economically disadvantaged homes, with mostly single parents who work multiple jobs and have to rely on the school for food assistance. Even more heartbreaking is that most of these children are home alone all day and many evenings while their parents work... now glued to school issued laptops. It dawned on me a couple of months ago, as I was trying to grasp how I could make any difference in the midst of a pandemic and a nasty partisan war over how to rescue our country from economic and social collapse, that the answer

might be quite simple, and right in my backyard. When I saw there was a vacancy in the Forest Hills Neighborhood Association for an Alex Sanger liaison, I signed up. What better way, I thought, to tune out the shouting on the political right and left and leverage my "privilege."

Sanger not only teaches disadvantaged kids to read and write but supports their families through a host of before and after school enrichment and sports programs. COVID has decimated that, leaving children isolated and more at risk than ever.

"Is there anything your Forest Hills neighbors can do to help?" I asked school administrators. "Yes," came the immediate response. "Now more than ever, we are needing community assistance as we help our students and families transition back to school," wrote Sanger's reading coach, Gillian Arteguin. Would you consider giving one hour a week, day or night, to read to a child online? It's that simple. The main help Sanger students need is reading assistance. What if we put together a team of neighbors to support our school through online tutoring and mentoring? The school has provided all the students with laptops and will provide everything we need to pull this off. My husband and I are signing up. Please join us! We'll start in October.

If you can help, send me your name and contact information and someone will be in touch. One thing I can almost guarantee: If your experience volunteering at Sanger becomes anything like mine you'll find that you're the one whose life is changed most by befriending a child in need.

Thanks for considering joining the effort and making a difference – and brightening a child's life.

Updates on FRI Activities

CreekSide—Ash Creek Urban Reserve

It is with great pride that Ferguson Road Initiative announces CreekSide, a 4.5-acre_urban reserve. CreekSide is the new 'brand name' for the Ash Creek Greenbelt Project. The new name emphasizes the creeks that run through our community and connect our neighborhoods, schools, and parks. Running parallel to the lower Ferguson Road corridor between Samuell Boulevard and Lakeland Drive, CreekSide will be preserved as a beautiful, lush, green space and native hardwood forest reserve adjacent to our vibrant and growing community. It is the result of collaborative planning efforts between FRI, the City of Dallas, Parks and Recreation Department, the Urban Land Institute and funded by a grant from the national 10-Minute Walk Campaign.

Tying into CreekSide is White Rock Hills Park, at 2229 Highland Road, the first phase of the future recreation center which will be in phase two, funded through Dallas' next bond program. The park is currently expected to be completed in November of this year, but the grand opening is postponed until fall 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Trinity Forest Spine Trail

The construction of Phase I will begin at the Santa Fe Trail, connect to Highland Road and continue southward to Samuell Blvd. Phase II will continue from Samuell Blvd. to the Lawnview DART station. The South Phase of this trail will run from the Lawnview DART station to Pemberton Hill Rd. near the Trinity River Audubon Center. The Trinity Forest Spine Trail will connect to White Rock Hills Park and the future recreation center via a new bike path planned for completion in 2022.

These new amenities will transform our recreation desert into a health and recreation destination. CreekSide neighborhoods will be within a 10-Minute Walk from a bike path or hiking trail to many parts of Dallas. This will be a huge asset for Forest Hills families, allowing us to bypass Garland Rd. and major intersections!

Ash Creek Trail

The future Ash Creek Trail will be nestled between Ferguson Road and Forest Hills and will connect Highland Rd. to St. Francis Park, creating a network of thriving communities along this greenbelt. The CreekSide-Ash Creek Urban Reserve will offer recreation and a natural respite for our residents. We believe it will be a catalyst for quality economic development in a community that has been traditionally underserved. Creating a safe, walkable urban environment, with connections to Dallas' vast network of parks, trails and recreation centers, will help make our community and the

broader East Dallas area a place where people will have a sense of pride and will want to live and raise their families.








Forest Hills Security

Our Forest Hills Security police officers, patrolling 55 hours per week are committed to keeping the 634 houses in our community protected. Serious crime has been significantly reduced, as well as property theft and car break-ins. But we must continue to keep up our guard and stay vigilant. Thugs are still roaming day and night in our neighborhood looking for any opportunity. Lock up your gates, garages, cars and firearms. Turn your alarm on anytime you leave your home.



Our neighborhood police can only patrol the amount of hours, that we can afford to pay. If you want to see more patrol cars, join the Security Program at the highest level you can afford.



YARD OF THE MONTH BY JULIE DUNN

July 2020 - Bill and Lisa Daves 8566 San Pedro Parkway



During the 3 years that they have lived at the corner of San Pedro & Lakeland, Lisa and Bill have created a welcoming yard that is as functional as it is attractive.

The landscaping shelters this Modern Prarie style home without overwhelming it, softly framing the house while directing your gaze toward the entryway. Here, magnificent blue glazed pots and mature Sago palms flank the front door. Red sun-loving Begonias cascade around the steps. And a bank of blue Salvia and yellow Lantana envelope the foundation.

Canopy of Pecans, Red Oaks, Lacy Bark Elms and Red Bud varietals drape a handsome walkway made of concrete squares and narrow stone slabs. A stone placard with fire-etched inscriptions reads "The Daves" as you approach the home, and "Go in peace" as you leave.

Although the Daves call themselves "gardening fools", there's nothing foolish about their garden design: The Nellie Stevens Hollies planted inside the line of existing pink Crepe Myrtles help further shield the property from the busy Lakeland thoroughfare. A new berm protects the corner where San Pedro intersects Lakeland. Plants to include beloved cacti and agaves were chosen for their water wise easy care and year around interest. Nothing feels utilitarian and yet, all of it was purposefully designed. This is a hard working landscape, as attractive as it is practical.

August 2020 - Chris and Courtney Panatier 8457 San Benito Way



Five wild green parrots happily feast at the bird feeder, so very much at home in this large open landscape! What better reward for having transformed a neglected corner lot at the intersection of Whittier and San Benito into a stimulating native garden in just ten months.

The biodiverse landscape that surrounds this "modern Prarie tree house" may seem like an unusual choice for a contemporary home, but it is well in keeping with an East Dallas esthetic. Pink Muhly grasses soften a xeriscaped berm. Native Mountain Laurels and Desert Willows dot the perimeter. A whimsical teepee flags a wild patch marked "nature garden." Everything seems to embrace an experimental and adventurous spirit.

Chris and Courtney knew they didn't just want a lawn; "We wanted the landscape to kind of spill out from the house." A walkway made of oversized dark slate stepping - stones helps achieve this effect. It carries you through a lush understory of shade loving sedges and Japanese Maples into a sunny yard. Milkweeds, and Rock Rose, Beauty Berries, Buddleias, and Salvias gently shelter this family friendly yard where there is plenty of space to enjoy and explore. Creatures of all kinds are drawn to this welcoming habitat including curious pedestrians who stop to investigate. What's new, what's changed? There's a lot going on at the Panatiers!




