

Our Security patrol officers are asking you to clean up your alleys for your security.

- Trim overgrown areas that create hiding places for thieves.
- Clean up debris to make it easier for the squad cars to patrol. Lock back gates.
- Place house number on back gate/fence to identify your home in case of Police or Fire emergency.
- Sprucing up will also facilitate the continuance of alley garbage and recycling pick up to those households who currently receive this service, allowing city vehicles to enter easily.
- Clean up leaves and any deteriorated foliage in alleys which have turned to dirt, creating damns that prevent water drainage, giving mosquitos a place to breed.
- Pretty up your property behind the scenes.



## Taking Care of Our Neighborhood On-the-Go with the 311 App

You know the pothole that you walk by every day? The bulk trash that's put out three weeks early? Or the street that really needs a stop sign to slow speeding cars? You wonder when the city will ever take action? **Action is what you'll get with the 311 App.** From your smartphone you can submit a service request and track your request.

#### Here's how it works:

- ◆ Download the free App from the Apple iTunes App Store or the Google Play Store.
- Once downloaded, you have the ability to submit a photo from your phone and use the GPS to aid in exact location of your service request. These two submissions save the city time, which ultimately helps with a quicker resolution.

#### Here are a few 311 App testimonials--

"The other day I spotted a pothole near the corner of Blackburn and Cole. I immediately got on my phone and quickly saw that others had reported it, too."


"Several utility boxes in our alley were trashed with graffiti. I took a picture with my iPhone and added my location with the GPS. About four days later I received a notice saying the case was closed. Sure enough, the graffiti had been painted over."

The 311 App allows us to be proactive residents seeking to keep our neighborhood safe and clean. Give it a try!

## The Preservation of Pioneer Memories

Saturday, January 24, Forest Hills neighbors, along with the General Society of the War of 1812 and the US Daughters of 1812 gathered at the historic Warren Angus Ferris Cemetery on St Frances and San Leandro for the dedication of a military gravestone. The marker in honor of The War of 1812, Private Benjamin Dye is replacing one of the hundred plus headstones, which were vandalized and destroyed over the years. "The War of 1812 is often called America's Second War of Independence, credited with opening the Western frontier to expansion, solidifying the Untied States as a Nation, establishing the U.S. as an international power."

One of the speakers, Susanne Starling told of the life of Warren Angus and the early days living on his farm, which is now Forest Hills. She talked of this area, where Ferris and Private Nye lived and the communities nearby whose many pioneer families were buried in the cemetery. Her book is a fascinating read with many historic facts about Forest Hills and Dallas County. Land is the Cry - Warren Angus Ferris, Pioneer Texas Surveyor and Founder of Dallas County by Susanne Starling.





## PLANNING AND ZONING UPDATE FOR FOREST HILLS

Greetings from your District 9 Planning Commissioner, and Forest Hills neighbor. From a zoning perspective, things have been relatively peaceful in our area. The one source of excitement and mild concern, both, has been the opening of the Arboretum Village Shopping Center, operated by Lincoln Properties. The revitalization of the shopping center at Garland/Gaston/Grand is key in improving the area, and the opening of the various retail establishments seems to be enjoying strong neighborhood support. This support has brought increased traffic to the already busy Gaston/Garland/Grand intersection.

The Arboretum Village development did not require a zoning change, as the property was already zoned for commercial use, and the building/remodeling process ran quite smoothly as a result. Because there was no zoning change needed, and because building permits were granted individually for each of the premises within Arboretum Village, no overall traffic impact study had been done for the complex prior to construction. Happily, the openings of the various establishments have raised interest and have brought much commercial activity to the center. With these positive developments has come the concern over increased traffic difficulties, primarily making left-hand turns into or out of the shopping center areas on both side of Gaston.

To address these concerns, a meeting was held with Lincoln to discuss remedies. Lincoln Properties engaged a highly-regarded traffic consultant to conduct a study of the general surrounding access to the Arboretum Village now that much of the retail is open and the construction is coming to an end. While traffic patterns are not fully stabilized because of further retail openings in the near future, as well as the opening of the new YMCA, the traffic consultant was able to make an assessment of safety and traffic flow concerns. Their recommendation has been to place a signal light at Tucker and Gaston, to enable left-turns into and out of the Arboretum Village and to assist neighborhood traffic coming from Tucker into the Arboretum Village, as well. The City Traffic Department has reviewed the consultant's recommendation and concurs. Efforts are underway within the City to secure funding for such signal light installation, and to elevate its priority on the list of pending signals to be installed, so hopefully the problems will be alleviated in the near future. Stay tuned!

## **BULKY TRASH SIGNS**

By now most of you have seen the BULKY TRASH signs that many of your neighbors have put out to help with our new program. As a reminder - when you see the signs that means you can start putting your trash out by the curb on that Thursday - Sunday. The City will then come around and pick it up the first part of the next week. I have visited with the Code Enforcement and he has been putting out warnings to some if their trash is out before this window of time. A ticket is \$261! So please work within the time frame of the City and save your money!

March 5 - 8 · April 9 - 12 · May 7 - 10 · June 4 - 7 · July 9 - 12

August 6 - 9 · September 10 - 13 · October 8 - 11

November 5 - 8 · December 10 - 13

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
