Frightening Experience for one of our Neighbors and her PLEA all of us!

"A few weeks ago, I was at home alone and my security alarm went off. I was in the back of the house. The security monitoring company called me and reported it. I told them I was alone and it should not be going off. They reported it as a window in another part of the house and called 911. I locked myself in the back bath with a gun, waited 10 minutes and called 911 myself. The 911 operator could not tell if the report had been called in and took my information again, she repeated my phone and address wrong to me, I corrected her. I waited another 15 minutes hiding in my back bath with the gun. I called again. I was told the police were on their way. I could see the front of my house and saw the officers drive up. I talked to them through the locked area and then let them in. A window had blown out and was hanging from the seal. The plants were broken but the pane did not break. One officer put the window back in while the other one searched the house and back areas.

IT TOOK OVER 25 MINUTES FOR THE DALLAS POLICE DEPARTMENT TO REACH MY HOME.

It could have been a serious situation! • **LONG RESPONSE TIME!** • **I WAS ALONE!** • **INEFFICIENT 911 OPERATOR!**

If there had been a BURGLAR, I would have been in great peril!

If our NEIGHBORHOOD CRIMEWATCH officers HAD BEEN on patrol THEY WOULD HAVE BEEN HERE IN LESS TIME!

*Please encourage your neighbors to join the security program so we can **increase our crimewatch patrol hours!***

FOREST HILLS SECURITY PROGRAM The Hard Facts:

By way of introduction, my name is Bob Wood and I have been selected by the FHSP Board to represent the group as its president for 2014. My email address is fhnacrimewatch@aol.com. As incoming president, my task is to maintain the momentum gained by Greg Estell, outgoing president, and the Board from 2013. They established enough in the fund to pay the DPD for the increase in hours – our crime stats reflect those efforts. **The fund has been depleted and we need the 350 households to maintain the +/-35 hours of patrol a week including deep night shift patrols.** Our agenda this year is to increase communication to residents with more information about crime in and around Forest Hills and the need to be ever aware of our surroundings and those of our neighbors. Additionally, we will continue to work with Dallas Police Department in their analysis of crime statistics for patterns in Forest Hills to effectively deploy our FHSP patrol officers. We will also be reaching out to all the newcomers with FHSP information.

From Dennis Reed, Treasurer for the Forest Hills Security Program:

*"2013 was the most successful year in the history of this important program! Participation was at an all-time high and several generous individuals made large and much needed donations. The additional funds enabled the FHSP to increase weekly patrol hours and provide additional hours of patrols during the Holiday periods of Thanksgiving and Christmas, times of increased theft in most neighborhoods. Perhaps you have seen late at night, the patrol car take down lights and side alley lights. They are part of the deep night patrol shifts added mid year to offset the increase in wheel thefts. We saw good results with fewer wheel thefts the remainder of 2013. **It is proven that crime stats go down when additional hours are added at times of high vulnerability. However, these increased hours cannot be maintained without an increase in the number of residents making the base contribution to the FHSP. Currently there are 304 households participating – our break-even to maintain our current patrol hours is 350!** Especially at the end of the year funds run low so it's important to make your 2014 contribution of \$240 now. And don't forget – donations in excess of \$240 qualify for a charitable donation deduction on your income tax return."*

Our number one objective is participation. PARTICIPATION IS THE KEY. Remember, the patrol cars you see in Forest Hills are a direct result of your contributions to FHSP, not your tax dollars at work.

DEAR SECURITY CHICK,

My neighbor received an eblast alerting Forest Hills about an assault/robbery and tips on being aware and keeping safe. I didn't get the notice. How can I get future notices? I want to be informed.

Need to Know

DEAR NEED TO KNOW,

This is what you NEED TO KNOW to help the police help you:

- 1. CRIME WATCH. SEE SOMETHING. SAY SOMETHING.** Call 911 if you see someone or something suspicious. Give good descriptions and get license plate numbers, if you can do it safely. If FHSP patrol is on duty, they will hear the dispatch and be there in minutes.
- 2. INTRODUCE YOURSELF and EXCHANGE contact NUMBERS with NEIGHBORS** beside you, across the street and the alley. Look out for each other.
- 3. CONTRIBUTE TO THE SECURITY PROGRAM.** The FHSP patrol is the **added protective layer** at our borders, on the streets and sidewalks of our neighborhood, watching over us. Those police cars send out another form of communication to the criminal world, that they need to go elsewhere and that Forest Hills' residents are unified in the fight against crime. **More contributions EQUAL more FHSP patrol hours, EQUAL less crime.** Stats show when police are present, there are fewer crimes.
- 4. BE INFORMED.** Receiving the quickest notice about events, zoning, and notifications of crime by **adding or updating your email address on the EBLAST LIST.** Communication and being aware are good crime prevention tools.

Here's how to sign up for eblast notices: Go to foresthillsdallas.org
At top menu bar click "Get Involved" button.
Click "Get Connected" on side menu to fill out the form.

Needing Peace of Mind

DEAR NEEDING PEACE OF MIND,

If you are a current subscriber to the Forest Hills Security Program, you receive the **added benefit of a police officer checking your home when you are away** for an extended time or during a period of building or remodeling your home.

Sorry they do not do lawn work or carpentry! But in checking to see if windows/doors are secure, picking up flyers/newspapers, they have been known to observe problems with A/C, lights, pool pump and have contacted the resident! The Home Watch form* has a place for special instructions, pets present, your security company, contact names/numbers while you are away, vehicles in driveway/garage and more.

DEAR SECURITY CHICK,

I'm a big fan of the Forest Hills Security Program. When my family and I visited the State Fair this year we got into a conversation with a police officer and told him we live in Forest Hills. He was familiar with our Security Program and told us it is the standard for other neighborhood programs. We were so proud.

Security Chick, wouldn't it be nice if we had a get together like the twice a year **neighborhood General Meeting to spread the word and learn more about our Security Program?** Perhaps we could meet at Sanger Elementary sometime soon? Of course not only do we need notification for the date and time, but your sound advice on what to wear.

You can save the form on your computer to make a copy and fill out each time you want this service. Instructions are on the form as to where to email it. The form is put into the officers patrol logbook at the NE station, so each time they are on patrol for FHSP, your home will be checked. It is shredded at the station after the requested watch time.

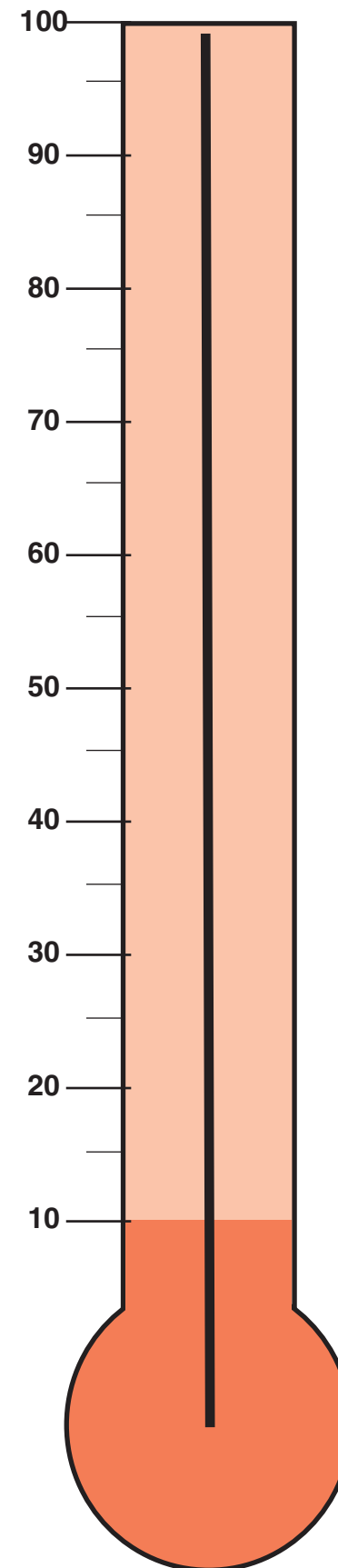

Winter is an Opportune Time for Pruning Trees

Winter is a good time to prune deciduous trees as the absence of leaves reveals structural flaws that can be addressed efficiently.



While the best time for pruning may depend on the tree species, the most overlooked time for pruning is winter. A frequent question asked of our team of Certified Arborists is, "When is the best time to prune." The simple answer is that trees can be pruned any time of the year, as long as they are pruned correctly and **no more than 25 percent of the tree's canopy is removed.** But winter pruning might be the most opportune time with many trees. For deciduous trees, those that drop their leaves in the fall, winter reveals the full structure of the trunk and branches, exposing crossed or rubbing limbs.

For trees in the Oak Group, winter pruning has definite advantages. Both Red Oaks and Live Oaks are susceptible to Oak Wilt disease, and as a rule, should not be pruned between late February and late June without painting pruning cuts.

Live Oaks and Red Oaks can be pruned until mid-February without the risk of being exposed to the insect that spreads the Oak Wilt fungus spores.



That is the season when climate conditions favor the spread of Oak Wilt by the beetle that carries the fungal spores from infected trees to healthy trees. Therefore, from a disease management perspective, pruning during the dormant season is favorable. An added benefit for pruning Live Oaks in the winter is the opportunity to thin the canopies and reduce end weight on branches that break from the load of our snow or ice storms. Experience has shown that the trees we care for on a regular basis suffer less from storm damage than other trees in the same neighborhood.

There are a few trees, such as Cedar Elm, Hackberry, and Texas Red Oak, that are susceptible to Mistletoe. Winter is the best time to manage this tree parasite, since it is so much easier to spot in leafless trees. In mature trees, infested limbs 2 inches in diameter and less are usually removed.



Mistletoe is easy to spot and remove during winter pruning.

Larger limbs can be removed if doing so does not compromise the structure or aesthetics of the tree. Infestations on large limbs are difficult to eliminate, so the mistletoe is removed at the attachment point to the branch. In most cases, repeating the process on a three-year rotation is frequent enough to prevent the mistletoe from producing the seeds that spread the parasite to other limbs and to adjacent trees.

Sometimes, homeowners delay pruning on deciduous trees until spring or summer, when it is easy to see any deadwood that needs to be removed. While that seems logical, our climbers are highly skilled at identifying deadwood during the dormant season, and can remove it efficiently.

Our experienced production climbers have no trouble identifying deadwood in deciduous trees.

Winter pruning can have another important advantage, in that we can usually schedule the work much quicker. Our production crews work year-round, and are available to prune throughout the winter months. We appreciate the opportunity to care for your trees, and your patience when demand is such that we are scheduling weeks out. TRASH TALK

DO YOU KNOW?

YOU CAN BE FINED UP TO \$2,000 FOR PUTTING OUT BRUSH, LEAVES AND BULK TRASH IN THE WRONG PLACE AND AT THE WRONG TIME.

THE RIGHT PLACE: Bulk Trash should be placed on curb area in front of your home.

NOT in the street or protruding out into the street from the curb. This presents a traffic hazard, especially after dark when the items can become invisible.

DO NOT put trash, leaf bags, etc. in park areas at St Francis/San Pedro/San Benito/Whittier. Please inform your lawn and tree service of correct placement.

THE RIGHT TIME: The week of the Second Monday

Put out by 7 am on the MONDAY of the collection week, but not earlier than the Thursday before.



DO NOT put trash, loose or bagged leaves and grass clippings on the common neighborhood medians, along wooded street areas or at any area that is not your property.



DO NOT put bags in the street or protruding out into the street from the curb.

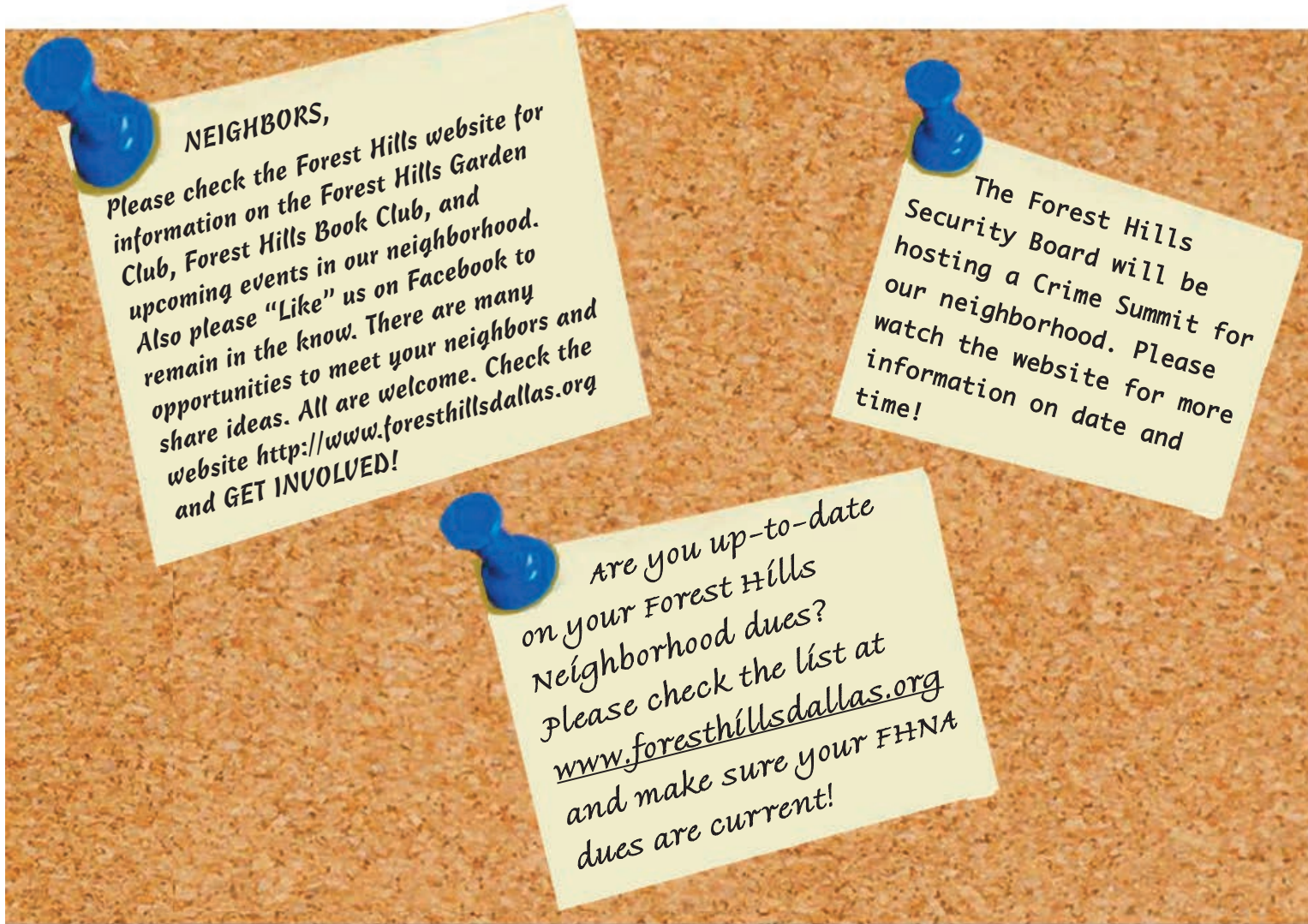

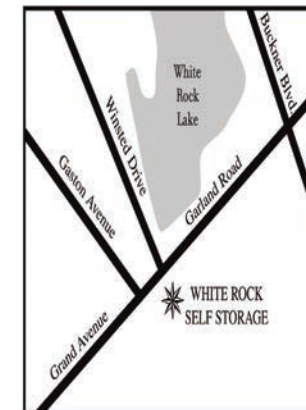
