

We have seen neighbors support one another during times of need, celebrate successes and family moments and just be there for one another. As our neighborhood evolves with some new home construction, upgrades of existing homes or simple upkeep projects, let's take this opportunity to welcome new neighbors to Forest Hills and also maintain the relationships we've already built. Along these lines, let's also keep in mind our elderly residents

make ourselves available to simply check in or help where needed. As we all know, it's not the homes we live in, but the lives we touch that make it all worthwhile and help build a stronger community and neighborhood.

As a simple update on the neighborhood beautification front, you may have noticed we've been busy working with the City of Dallas and the Mowmentum program to

plant (20) new trees along an initial stretch of Forest Hills boulevard and have the corresponding sprinkler system upgraded to help these new saplings grow and continue the expansion of our "forest in the City" for years to come. As part of this program, it is our intention to continue to have a minimum of (2) plantings per year for the next few years, budget allowing, and expand the coverage across various areas in the neighborhood to add trees and also flower/plant areas provided we can gain the appropriate approvals. Thanks to all who have helped us get started and to those of you looking to help in the future.

Lastly, regarding plantings and beautification, I'd like to mention we are have a community event coming

> up, the White Rock East Garden Tour. This event has been growing and getting great reviews over the years and provides a great opportunity to engage with some of your neighbors who are participating as well. So if you're around the neighborhood

in mid-May come make a visit and gain some fresh ideas on how to build an attractive landscape and be a little creative too.

ew at the Arboretum are **Wednesday Nature Nights** - extended attraction hours until 8 p.m. allowing visitors to enjoy a weeknight out in the garden.

t this time of year, what's better than a picnic dinner at dusk in a peaceful setting? From 6 p.m. to 7:30 p.m., budding artists will love finding Booker T. Washington students throughout the garden providing free instruction in various mediums to 6-12 year olds.

Speaking of kiddos, if you have little ones and have not yet explored the **Rory Meyers Children's Adventure Garden**, absolutely make time for it. This 8-acre interactive area of the garden is geared for the young and the young-at-heart. In it, the Arboretum brilliantly blends nature and fun with science and technology to create an educational, outdoor environment that stimulates little minds.

It is great fun to see your child's wheels turning as she absorbs the beauty that is our earth, or to watch him explore the tree canopy as he darts along the Texas Skywalk. Daily Plant Lab experiments allow kids to

understand plant life cycles and how they respond to nature among other things. In May, some coming experiences include:






Dream Cafe now in the hood

Popular local restaurant opens at Mockingbird and Abrams

If you have tried to get a seat at the new Dream Cafe around noon and found yourself waiting, you are not alone. The popular local restaurant opened to huge crowds in April.

The restaurant took the space once occupied by Fuzzy's Tacos and the owners have expanded into the space next door. The decor has a hip Austin vibe and is comfortable with cool colors, shiplap walls and watercolor art work. It also has a great outdoor space with plans to expand a children's area.

The menu caters to the healthier crowd with fresh smoothies, a juice bar and items like Shrimp tacos and scrambled tofu. Dream Cafe only uses locally sourced dairy, cage free eggs and organic legumes and grains. All the meats are also local and nitrate and hormone free. Dream Cafe opened its first restaurant in 1988.
