

### UNDERSTANDING & CARING FOR COMMUNITY CATS

ave you noticed an increase in Missing Cat posters around the neighborhood? I sure have and one belongs to me. Seeing the posters made me wonder about the circumstances surrounding each cat's disappearance and the worried family looking for their pet or free roaming cat.

In my case, our outside community cat was trapped and relocated miles away without our knowledge. This beautiful calico was born across the street and within the last few years I trapped her and two siblings as part of a TNRM (Trap, Neuter, Return, and Monitor) program encouraged by Dallas Animal Services and ASPCA. All three cats were taken to Spay Neuter Network at 2223 S Buckner where they received spay/ neuter surgery, rabies shot, microchip, and an ear-tip. After the procedure, I brought each cat back to our yard and released them where I continued to provide food and water every day. The white/orange male wondered off, the white/black female returned to the home of her birth across the street, and the calico remained in and around our yard until she was taken away in July.

I took pride in being the caretaker of this little colony of community cats and have learned a great deal about the role from some cat experts in East Dallas. Here are some things I have learned:

- Community cats are outdoor, unowned, freeroaming cats.
- Not all cats that have been TNR'd (spay/neutered and returned) are monitored and cared for.
- Not all TNR programs provide an ear-tip which is a common sign that a cat has been spay/neutered (ask your provider).

- TNR results in a stable, healthy, non-reproductive colony that minimizes fighting, spraying, and new kittens.
- It is important to learn about the benefits of a healthy community cat colony and ways to deter unwanted behavior in and around your yard.
- Community cats control rodent populations without the use of harmful chemicals.
- Many of your Forest Hills neighbors have TNR'd cats and care for these community cat colonies.
- Your neighbors need to both understand and respect the community cats you care for to prevent the inhumane practice of relocation.

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
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# YARD of the MONTH

While many yards succumbed to the late August heat, Debbie Knight's shone like an

oasis. Caladiums and Coleus looked brilliant against the varied cool shades of her undulating perennial beds. "They say don't plant Caladiums before Mother's Day, but I never plant mine until mid-June; they only last about 90 days", she says. This is shade gardening at its best where colorful annuals nestle into an evergreen backdrop of Japanese Aurelia, Speckled Aucuba, Mahonia, Encore Azaleas and ferns.

When Debbie and George bought the house in 1976, "Groveland was the kind of street you didn't go down unless you lived there." They had very few neighbors and they all faced an old farm property, 3.5 acres of woods and wildlife. Twenty years later the farm was still there, but the Knights were changing things up: they built a welcoming stone porch, dug up Ligustrum bushes, created larger, less formal planting beds and lined them with beautiful river rocks.

If the front yard is an oasis, the back yard is a little slice of Eden overflowing with Hostas and Maples, Jewels of Opar and Spider Lilies. Gardening - is it relaxing? As she contemplates the weeding and the watering, the potting, the dividing, trimming, overwintering... she smiles. "Maybe a better word would be therapeutic."

### ROAD CITY SIDEWALKS,

With the last half-year of quarantining and working from home, my wife Linda and I have been walking much more for exercise. Besides being more connected to our community, our time together and the beauty of our neighborhood were a real gift. During these walks I began to notice different things about the sidewalks in Forest Hills and the surrounding neighborhoods. A number of questions came to mind and thought to reach out to Paula Blackmon, our City Council representative for some answers. She and her office were very helpful in providing me a better understanding. I thought others might also want to know, so here are my questions and their condensed responses.

### WHO OWNS SIDEWALKS?

Typically, the sidewalk is located on public right-of-way for the use of pedestrians; however, city ordinance requires property owners to replace sidewalks, drive approaches or any other associated element when they become defective, unsafe or hazardous.

### WHO IS RESPONSIBLE FOR SIDEWALK MAINTENANCE?

The abutting property owner per Chapter 43, Article III, Sec. 43-63 of the Dallas City Code.

### HOW DOES SOMEONE HAVE THEIR BROKEN SIDEWALK REPLACED IN FRONT OF THEIR HOME?

The City partners with property owners through the Sidewalk Replacement Program to share the cost 50/50 for existing residential removal and replacement. For additional program details please contact our office at (214) 948-4127 or (214) 948-4125. Additionally, property owners have the options to hire a private contractor to make repairs.

DO PROPERTY OWNERS HAVE LIABILITY EXPOSURE FOR SIDE-WALKS AT THEIR PROPERTY WHEN NOT MAINTAINED (WHERE CRACKED, UNEVEN, BUCKLED, ETC.)?

Yes, per Chapter 43, Article III, Sec. 43-33 (LIABILITY OF ABUTTING PROPERTY OWNERS FOR INJURIES CAUSED BY DEFECTIVE SIDEWALKS) of the Dallas City Code.

### **BUSY SIDEWALKS**

HOW CAN SOMEONE LEARN ABOUT PLANS FOR INSTALLATION OF SIDEWALKS IN THEIR NEIGHBORHOOD, WHERE NONE EXIST?

The Property Owner Petition Program provides property owners with a method whereby unimproved streets, alleys, and sidewalks can be improved to urban standards which consists of concrete payement, curb, sidewalk, drive approach, and any necessary storm drainage improvements.

WHAT IS THE STORY BEHIND THE MANY ADA ACCESSIBLE SIDEWALK ENTRANCES (INSTALLED AT STREET CORNERS, THROUGHOUT DALLAS) WHERE NO SIDEWALKS CURRENTLY EXIST?

The Barrier Free Ramp program provides for the construction of new barrier free ramps (BFR's) at street intersections, crosswalks or other identified paths intended for pedestrian use in crossing a vehicular way where BFR's do not exist. Additionally, BFR's projects are requested by the general public. However, the priority is given to walkways serving government offices and facilities (including schools), Health care facilities (hospitals, clinics, retirement facilities, etc.), bus stops and transportation centers (DART), Commercial District (private businesses offering goods and services to the public), followed by walkways serving residential areas.

### WHAT ELSE SHOULD BE MENTIONED ABOUT SIDEWALKS?

The Department of Public Works has identified a need to develop a Sidewalk Master Plan in conjunction with the City-wide ADA Self Evaluation and Transition Plan that establishes asset management policies for sidewalks through the use of a data driven model and stakeholder input to prioritize future improvements. The Sidewalk Master Plan will incorporate Equity, Safe Routes to School, ADA Transition Plan, and Five-Year Infrastructure Management Plan into a newly created sidewalk selection criteria matrix.


