SANGER ELEMENTARY AND MIDDLE SCHOOL OUR NEIGHBORHOOD SCHOOL NEEDS HELP!

Every morning, more than 500 children –as young as four years old--pour into Forest Hills. Most of them live a stone's throw away, in the apartments off Ferguson Road, but they play and learn how to read and write within the boundaries of our neighborhood...every day.

My job as your liaison with Sanger Elementary and Middle School is to find out what's happening in their lives and how we might be good neighbors.

I've met with the school's principal, head counselor and director of school volunteers. I asked, "What are the challenges your students face, and how can we best support you?" Here's what I learned:

Challenge #1: "Our students are hungry," said principal Hector Martinez. I had no idea. How can hundreds of children in our neighborhood be hungry? Many Sanger students go home after school to empty apartments and empty cupboards, because their parents—most of them single—work more than one job. The school has a food pantry that students can use every Thursday to get them through the weekend, but there's not enough in it.

WE CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE BY DROPPING OFF BAGS OF FOOD RIGHT INSIDE THE FRONT DOOR OF THE SCHOOL, WHERE A RECEPTIONIST WILL GLADLY RECEIVE IT.

It's simple. You can bring anything healthy and

easy for kids to prepare on their own: canned rice, beans, soup, peanut butter and jelly, cereal bars, granola; anything easy to pop in the microwave. The school will receive bags through June 17 and will start up again August 9th.

Look how people responded to our call for food via Eblast in May!



Challenge #2: Sanger Kindergartners and first graders need help learning how to read. The school is desperate for tutors and mentors beginning in September, when on campus enrollment is expected to swell to 750. Did you know that one of the greatest predictors of resilience in a child who has experienced trauma is whether they've had one adult who intervened as a friend and mentor? You could be it.

WE CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE IF JUST THIRTY OF US VOLUNTEER 30 MINUTES A WEEK TO MENTOR AND READ TO A KINDERGARTNER OR FIRST GRADER. I've done it. It's easy and rewarding.

Challenge #3: Many Sanger families are struggling economically and emotionally, after a year where COVID has severely disrupted life as we knew it. Sanger families are struggling. Some of them are recent migrants from El Salvador and Honduras.

PRINCIPAL MARTINEZ ASKED IF ANY OF US MIGHT BE WILLING TO ADOPT A SANGER FAMILY, becoming friends and neighbors who can help them better navigate life. This isn't about financial support. What if we teamed up by blocks to befriend one family?

Challenge #4: The school has maintained a beautiful vegetable garden over the past few years but construction necessitated it being moved and restarted on the St. Francis side. Principal Martinez is asking if any of us would like to help the children with the garden once school starts again in August.

I once heard Bryan Stephenson, social justice activist and author of Just Mercy, say that the best way to heal the divides in our country is to get "proximate" to people who don't look or live like we do. That seemed awkward to me... until it dawned on me that getting proximate to people who aren't like me is really as easy as stepping out my front door. Will you join me in being a good neighbor to the children who spend their days in our neighborhood?

It was wonderful to see so many neighbors at our Semi-Annual Spring Meeting on May 4th. This was our first in-person General Meeting in two years, and over 100

attended! Our neighborhood community is more active and vibrant than ever!

Some highlights:

- Our financial position is good, thanks to over 50% participation so far this year in membership dues. Thank you!
- The Trail-head (The Lot property) rezoning proposal status was outlined by Gloria Tarpley. The City Planning Commission did not approve it, but it was still to be decided by City Council.
- A new FHNA Directory is under development, being done Online (see Page 13 of this newsletter). Please see the website to add your information (you can decide how much personal information to share).
- · Our Social Chairs are organizing our first (in a long time) National Night Out for October 5th.
- Security patrols (separate from your FHNA dues) are up to 60 hours a week, with over 52% of households participating so far this year. Thank you for helping keep us all safer!

FOREST HILLS YOUNG CHILDREN'S CLUB

This Club is focused on building community and bringing together families in Forest Hills who have young children ages 0-6. In a recent research study conducted by Action for Children, it was found that 52% of new parents felt both lonely and socially isolated. The Club was formed as a way to ensure that families in Forest Hills with young kids feel both connected and supported.

On Wednesday, May 19, over 50 women from Forest Hills came together to help raise money for the Club through a wine tasting event called "Women & Wine." Over half of the attendees do not have young children, but strongly believe in the Club's mission.



Event hosts Kate Reed and Melissa Pressley, along with Event Chairs Nicole Bossworth, Lauren McKinnon, Jessica Short, and Erin Wynne did a fantastic job mobilizing the community to pull the fundraiser together in less than a month!

Gathering after a year of isolation created a definite sense of joy and gratitude in the air – coupled with ample conversation and camaraderie! The event featured a wine tasting led by sommelier Heather Queen with Queen of Grapes, and a beautifully crafted display of charcuterie and light bites provided by Forest Hills resident Tate Gorsuch with Haute Southern. To add to the fun of the evening, more than 20 packages were put

together for a raffle and winners were drawn between each of the four wine tastings.

In the first 6 months of this year, we've made wonderful progress:



- · The FWFC is honored to be among the giants selected for this year's Preservation Dallas awards!
- We were invited to be featured in this year's East White Rock Lake Garden Tour. Neither torrential rain nor tornado warnings deterred over 100 guests to walk the grounds of the Warren Ferris Cemetery's wildlife habitat.
- · Two additional segments have been completed for our documentary, Ferris Cemetery, A Future, As Well As A Past. The topics
- Interview with Dr. George Keaton, founder of Remembering Black Dallas, and researcher Shaniqua Cummings, who are overseeing the search to find the names of those buried in the cemetery, including freedmen.
- Landscape Architect,



Michael Parkey, discusses our mission of restoring the land back Blackland Prairie status and its value in expanding the green belt for local and migratory wildlife as a



means to honor the Dallas pioneers buried there.

- A partnership with the Texas Conservation Alliance has been initiated with a generous donation of 80 native plants. This gift from TCA starts a relationship which will include other events at the cemetery.
- The first Monarch butterflies have arrived!
- Landscape Architect Michael Parkey now leads our monthly volunteer days with a tour to identify new native growth. Join us to learn what to plant to create a wildlife habitat in your yard...a fun project to share with your kids.
- An owl house and two bird houses have been installed.



YARD of the MONTH

An architectural designer by trade, Carol used her significant artistic talent in renovating both house and garden. What once was an overly shaded garden that half hid the house has been tamed. Planting beds have

been extended and lined with a creative combination of river rock and flagstone.

The garden is a plant lover's delight, filled with a mix of unusual selections recommended by their longtime garden designer and some of the Gantt's "more pedestrian" favorites. There's a Coral Bean plant with ruby red flower spikes growing near the driveway, a pink Camelia bush near the front door, Leopard Plants, and Japanese Grey Ferns around the Magnolia. The more familiar Hydrangeas, and Holly Ferns, Anemones and Impatiens are scattered across shady areas of the yard.

There is an extended curbside flowerbed, where Lantana cascades over the rock borders. Both the Russian sage with its delicate grey green foliage and light lavender flower, and the Buddleia's unusual magenta blooms are resplendent, as is the bright pink Rock Rose and the yellow Sundrops. The flower show will go on all summer as the Gauras, Saint John's Wort, Salvias, Shasta Daisies, and a Rose of Sharon are yet to bloom.

Nestled in the midst is a flagstone landing lined in lime green Carex where two rocking chairs beckon the weary innovators to rest and enjoy our wonderful neighborhood.

The multicolored Impatiens are spectacular this year at the corner of San Leandro and San Rafael. In fact, the whole landscape is grand. This mature garden was already beautiful when the Hughes moved in with their 5 young children in 1975. They've cared for it ever since, changing out the seasonal annuals twice a year, faithfully pruning and feeding the trees as needed, and most recently, replacing a good number of plants fatally damaged by our winter storm.

There is beauty in giving your plants the necessary room to flourish. In this garden, the oakleaf hydrangea and the Aralia Japonica plants, the Japanese maple and the Pitch Pine have all been given sufficient room to reach their natural stature.

Their unique shapes add graceful support to the landscape. The canopy of live oaks makes one feel like they are walking through a cathedral.


Creative uses of rock enhance the front yard. Stone outcroppings add a naturalizing effect. Even the crushed rock that lines the house's foundation, has been beautified by an undulating ribbon of river rock designed to mimic a stream bed.

PROGRESS ON FIRST PHASE OF THE TRINITY FOREST SPINE TRAIL

Ferguson Road Initiative.
The Trinity Forest Spine
Trail is one step closer to
breaking ground. In late May,
the Park Board approved
the construction award
for the first phase of the
Trinity Forest Spine Trail, a
big milestone for The LOOP
and our community. In
early June, the Dallas City
Council will consider the
construction award and they
hope to break ground soon
after.

The Trinity Spine Trail will serve portions of Dallas

that have historically been left out of major pedestrian infrastructure projects. First on the list for construction, this phase of the Trinity Forest Spine Trail will connect the Santa Fe Trail north of the Tenison Park Golf Course in East Dallas to Samuell Blvd, just north of I-30. The CTC is fulfilling a promise made to the East Dallas neighborhoods 20 years ago, formalized in the 2013 Trinity Forest Spine Trail master plan. Building a reliable trail from White Rock Lake to the Great Trinity Forest will turn this overlooked corridor into one of the most significant greenbelts in North Texas.

The Trail will offer alternative transportation routes for communities that have long been cut off from jobs and other economic opportunities. Over the last few years, Philip's organization worked with neighborhood groups, community leaders and others to ensure The LOOP provides connection and passes through areas where access to green space and alternative transportation are needed most. By bridging geographic barriers that have isolated neighborhoods from transportation hubs, The LOOP provides a walkable and bike-able solution to increase accessibility across the nation's fastest growing metro area.

FRI is thrilled to see the exciting progress being made and to deliver a project that will

be an equitable connection to economic opportunity across the city.



The first phase of the Trinity Forest Spine Trail will provide unprecedented views of White Rock Creek; trail users will pass under this historic railroad trestle just south of Forest Hills and the White Rock Lake Spillway.
