What Can You Do?

If you observe criminal or suspicious activity, CALL 911 to REPORT the incident. IF our ENP officer is on duty, she/he will IMMEDIATELY go to the scene of the incident. The following are things you can do to help reduce criminal activity.

- Secure your homes, garages, and cars. Gates that lead to the backyard should always have a lock on them. Prevent crimes of opportunity!
- Always keep valuables and fire arms locked up.
- Activate your alarm systems when you leave the house, even for a short time.
- Prevent vehicle break-ins! Be sure your vehicle is locked and do not leave valuables visible inside the vehicle. **Best Practices Tip - Additionally, if you have a keyless ignition system, it is possible for thieves to relay your car's key

for thieves to relay your car's key fob signal to break in and/or steal your car. The best way to prevent this is to keep your key fob in a Faraday bag/cage which is an enclosure that blocks all electromagnetic fields.

WASTE WARRIORS

I Dig Composting

Think about what vou consume in the morning. For me, it's lemon water, celery juice, coffee, fresh-squeezed orange juice, a banana, and in the summer, melon too. That creates a lot of daily garbage: a lemon rind, celery pulp, three orange rinds, banana peel, melon rinds and seeds, and coffee grounds. During the pandemic, I decided to give composting a try. I started dumping all my kitchen waste into a pile



on the side of my house. A year and a half later, I have added hundreds of pounds of vegetable, fruit, and grass trimmings, but the pile has decomposed into a tenth of that – and it even looks like soil!

Composting makes a big difference to the amount of trash we generate. The City of Dallas reports at least **30 percent** of what goes into the Dallas landfill is compostable. Why not give it a

try? If you'd rather leave it to the professionals, you can join a subscription service like **Recycle Revolution** or **Turn**, and they will provide you with buckets and pick-up service, and even bring the organic soil back to you. Both Turn and Recycle Revolution offer composting services in Dallas

YARD of the MONTH

When this Cape Cod styled home was built in the 30's. the owners planted a Pecan tree to shade the house from the summer heat. Today, it bears the most delicious paper shell pecans in the Fall, framing the McFarland's landscape majestically.

The color palette for this perennial shade garden is intentionally green and white. Depth and interest are created by varying the sizes and shapes of the plants as well as their leaf colors and textures. There are just a few spots designed for seasonal color. A layer of White Caladiums highlights the fern bed and variegated Hostas that surround the Pecan tree. A pocket of ruby throated Cong Coleus fronts a backdrop of jubilant Elephant Ears, Snowball Vibernum and St. John's Wart to name a few. The Japanese Maple that anchors the driveway corner gives way to a sunny side yard, where colorful flowering perennials are in their prime.

Although it was expensive to install this undulating foundation bed back in '96, the results have proven economical in the long run. With the help of a landscape designer's plan, Greg did most of the planting and Christie has tended it ever since. "I love gardening! Pulling weeds, it's very zen. I love to sweep; it chills me out. And I love perennials! They are so great! ... With kids and jobs," Christie remembers, "a perennial garden just made a lot of sense." This renovated ranch home feels hip and contemporary thanks to the landscaping choices the Marrs have made to date. Having no back yard to speak of, they needed a functional and attractive side yard for their young children to play in. Their architect and landscape designer gave them valuable advice as they created a garden that protects the kids from the street and shields the neighbors from a direct view of the swing set and extensive vegetable garden. The result is a very smart,

black 'hog wire' half fence with a xeriscaped border which achieves the goal without blocking out the neighborhood. As John explains, "We all love Forest Hills because of the forest and the trees!"

The landscaping provides a changing vista for neighbors and passers-by of Yuccas and Desert Willow blooms giving way to red Salvia and Black-Eyed Susan, and now, the delicate lavender blooms of Texas Sage. Behind it, green beans and tomatoes, herbs, lettuce and cucumbers happily ripen thanks to the visiting bees and hummingbirds. Cantaloupe and watermelon vines peek through the fence. It's a harmonious marriage of form and function.

The Marrs have watched the fence line garden bounce back from our terrible freeze. It's proof positive that our native plants best tolerate our North Texas climate.

Greetings neighbors – here's a quick update on some key activities and announcements involving Ferguson Road Initiative (FRI).

BLOOD DRIVE

In July, FRI's annual blood drive exceeded last year's results and Carter Bloodcare's expectations - thank you, all!

COVID-19 IN FAR EAST DALLAS

FRI was awarded a grant from North Texas CARES to help address Vaccine Hesitancy. We learned that our key zip code 75228 reports less than 25% of the population has been vaccinated, but in the more affluent zip code 75218 the rate is near 50%. FRI is piloting pop-up vaccinations clinics throughout Far East Dallas to bring the vaccine directly to people who live in apartments, frequent our area businesses, and attend our schools and churches. CREEKSIDE - ASH CREEK URBAN RESERVE / WHITE ROCK HILLS PARK—GRAND OPENING

Save the date! All in the community are invited to join us on Saturday, November 6, 2021, to celebrate the Grand Opening of CreekSide/White Rock Hills Park from 10 a.m. – 1 p.m. at 2229 Highland Road. In partnership with the City of Dallas, FRI celebrates this milestone event. Twenty-two years of advocacy work have transformed a crime-ridden apartment and illegal dumpsite at Highland Road into a recreation and trail-connection designation: the White Rock Hills Park, Trinity Forest Spine Trail, Highland Road Complete Street, Highland/ Ferguson Intersection Improvement and future White Rock Hills Recreation Center. Join us rain or shine for this landmark event that will include our community leaders and ribbon cutting.



WHITE ROCK HILLS PARK is the first phase of the future recreation center, phase two to be funded in Dallas' next bond program. The park is one step toward addressing the recreation desert that has existed along the lower Ferguson Road corridor for decades. It is a terrific example of the power of a people working together for the greater good. Trees will be planted in -the coming months.

TRAIL CONNECTIVITY

Construction of the Trinity Forest Spine Trail Phase I has begun and will start at the Santa Fe Trail, connect to Highland Road, and then continue southward to Samuell Boulevard. Phase II will continue from Samuell Boulevard to the Lawnview DART station. The South Phase will run from the Lawnview DART station to Pemberton Hill Road near the Trinity River Audubon Center. The Trinity Forest Spine Trail will connect to White Rock Hills Park and the future recreation center via a new bike path to be included in the improvement of the Highland Road Complete Street, scheduled for completion in early 2022.

FERGUSON ROAD INITIATIVE UPDATE: EVENTS

INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS AT LAKELAND DRIVE / FERGUSON ROAD

The improvements here are scheduled to begin early next year. The intersection design at Lakeland Drive will be replicated at Highland and Ferguson Roads.

FRI continues to plan for new projects. These include exploring innovative ways the Claremont Village Shopping Center at Ferguson and Highland can be revitalized. FRI is also exploring ways we can engage a healthcare partner to establish a Senior Activity Center at the old grocery store until the Recreation Center is built.
