DEAR FOREST HILLS NEIGHBORS, What a year 2020 was ... happy to have it finally behind us now! But, amid all of the craziness that last year brought, I never stopped feeling exceedingly lucky to be living here in our beautiful Forest Hills. This very idea of "feeling lucky" to live here, was our Forest Hills Neighborhood Association (FHNA) Membership Drive theme last year.

And I am so happy to say that last year 50% of our neighbors shared the same sentiment, and showed their love and appreciation for Forest Hills by supporting the FHNA and paying their 2020 dues. Our neighborhood can only be this wonderful with your continued financial support.

In 2019, only 20% of homes were paying their annual dues, but in 2020 we were able to raise that amount to 50%! We had two major Membership Drives last year (in March and July), but this year, we would like to focus all of our fundraising energy to the first several months of the year, to help us plan our budget.

You may have also noticed that in 2020, we had a revived sense of community, which was in great part due to our wonderful new Social Chairs, Sara Winwood and Carrie Bevers. These two wonderfully creative ladies have lots of energy and fantastic ideas for 2021 ... but it is only through your support that the FHNA will be able to afford and budget for these events accordingly.

The Forest Hills Neighborhood Association is a nonprofit organization, with a Board of Directors, whose mission is primarily to enhance our fabulous community through various ways. The spirit of Forest Hills is brought to life through our annual social events (Easter Egg Hunt, 4th of July Picnic & Parade, Turkey Trot & Tree Lighting), the beautification of common areas (electricity and water for irrigation), by providing semi-annual general meetings, and by communicating with our neighbors through our Forest Hills website (which was just re-done!), eblasts and the *Forest Hills News* newsletter. The FHNA clearly cannot run effectively without neighbors pitching in and paying their membership dues.

We have strived to keep our dues as low as possible over the years, assuming that a majority of neighbors will voluntarily participate. The annual FHNA dues are \$50 per household, and only \$30 for our senior households.

 Please pay attention to your short legged friends!






SPOTLIGHT ON THE ARBORETUM

Honoring & Restoring Forest Hills' Neighborhood History & Natural Beauty







he neighborhoods of Forest Hills and Little Forest Hills in Dallas are located on the original homestead of pioneer Warren Angus Ferris. Our only physical reminder of the history that we live upon is the 1847 Ferris Historic Cemetery, located at corner of San Leandro and St. Francis - home to the final resting place of prominent early Dallas settlers. Due to vandalism over the past 100 years and invasive species overgrowth, this gem has been hidden away from us until last year, when owners of the properties bordering the cemetery joined forces to create the 501c(3) non-profit organization Friends of Warren Ferris Cemetery. The mission is to recognize and honor those buried there; design and execute a landscape restoration plan; beautify and maintain the landscape to the standards of a certified wildlife and monarch butterfly way station; and to promote environmental stewardship.

Cemeteries are important keys to Texas' past. By tying together historical, educational and native wildlife components, we envision the Warren Ferris Cemetery project to be a template guiding other neighborhoods across the state in revitalizing their own fallen cemeteries, as well as for study and improvement of the greenbelt in the middle our Forest Hills neighborhood, extending from San Leandro Drive to Whittier Avenue.

Forest Hills History: Some Concrete Information

n our neighborhood, you can see some interesting history stamped in the concrete on some sidewalks and curbs. Concrete is a blend of water, sand, aggregates (like gravel) and cement as the binder. Modern concrete was developed in the early 19th century in England and the first concrete road in America was built in Ohio in 1893. Millions of miles of streets and highways have been built since then.



In the early days of concrete construction, it was common for contractors to stamp the concrete with their name and date, for purposes of warranty and name recognition. Many of those marks can be seen in our neighborhood on the curbs and on the sidewalks.



Forest Hills was established in 1924 and construction of the first roads began soon afterwards. Many of the original stamps have been lost to remodeling, driveways and utility cuts. However, here are some of the stamps you can see around our neighborhood. The oldest I have spotted is from November 1926. Can you find one prior to this? If so, please let us let us know!

YARD of the MONTH

Yes, November's award goes to the Pascoe's ginkgo tree. It's been the most highly photographed and most visited spectacle this fall, as neighbors from near and far watched its fan shaped leaves turn a brilliant saffron yellow.

The tree predates John and Rana Pascoe's residency. "It was about half of its present size when we bought our home in 1984." Rana thinks it was planted back in the 60s by the original homeowners who owned a nursery. "I don't know why people don't plant more of them," as the tree requires little care. Neighbors John Sadler and Abbie Meyering have precious memories of their children playing in and under that tree. "One was especially fond of perching in it for hours on end."

Although it is not well known to Dallas, it is beloved by arborists for its shade and ornamental properties. Resilient

to drought and pests, it thrives in sunny, well drained soils and near creek beds. To archaeologists, the ginkgo tree is a botanical dinosaur, the only living species of the earliest prehistoric tree. Fossils of its distinctive fan



shaped leaves date back 270 million years!

Once thought extinct, it was rediscovered in China and has been cultivated for its medicinal value by the monks for at least 1,500 years. Western botanists brought seedlings to North America in the late 1600s. Recent DNA analysis reveals their genome is 3.5 times larger than humans, giving them their complex chemical defense system and strong antibacterial profile.

Knowing that ginkgos can live 660 years, it leaves one wondering whether future generations will protect this ancient treasure come what may.

The Star Magnolia and Variegated Privet frame the dining room windows. The colorful driveway bed is especially fun to view from the kitchen, where Karen stands at the sink and Dennis mans the cutting board.

To be invited into the garden is an invitation into the family's outdoor living room. It's a great place to converse over a glass of wine, watch the evening approach, and feel the magic of this little sanctuary.
