

Code Enforcement: Alley Cleanup






A resident is responsible for their alleyway from where the pavement starts behind their house to the middle of the alley where at that point the neighbor behind them is responsible.

During September, Code Enforcement will be looking for litter, high weeds, and obstructions in our alleyways. When it comes to vegetation (trees, shrubs, bamboo, etc.) they need to have a clearance of 15 feet straight up before any branches/overhang can extend over the alley.

Bulky Trash Week for October

Bulky Trash can go out Thursday, October 6 - Sunday, October 9 with pick up beginning on Monday, October 10.



When you see our Bulky Trash signs go out, and/or you get a FHNA e-blast notifying you of our Bulky Trash week, you may begin work cleaning up behind your property and pack the debris/trash as neatly as possible in front of your house for the Bulky Trash pick up.

YELLOW DOOR HANGERS

This fall *EVERYBODY* will be getting a Yellow Door Hanger as a reminder to check both in front and behind their house for litter and/or obstructions. This will not be a ticket, just a reminder.

The first Yellow Door Hanger is a courtesy reminder as Code Enforcement wants to give you time to address any problems you have. Later they will be checking and if they find any problems, will leave a citation giving you a number of days to correct the problem(s). That will be followed by another inspection and if the problem areas are not addressed, the homeowner will receive a ticket.

Check your alleyway now. If it's bad, start cleaning up as soon as possible to prepare for October.





<u>Calming Initiative to Address Traffic Safety</u>

I wanted to update everyone on an important topic raised in an earlier issue of the FHNA newsletter.

Recent pedestrian and traffic fatalities in Far East Dallas have spurred the Dallas Police and the Transportation Departments to address the issues of speed racing and unsafe streetlights along Ferguson Road from I-635 to I-30. Their approach is to categorize their activities to address these concerns through the Vision Zero plan. Vision Zero is a city-wide plan created to set a goal of eliminating traffic fatalities and cutting severe injuries in half by 2030. One of its strategies involves creating Calming Initiative studies to determine how traffic can be safely slowed and thus reduce fatalities and injuries along highspeed corridors.

In August 2021, the city successfully launched its first Calming Initiative study in Oak Cliff to explore ways to slow and control speed racing. Its success has been expanded to other areas in the city, including Ferguson Road from I-635 to I-30.

Vision Zero utilizes a multi-prong approach to solving the issue of speeding called the "3-E's": Enforcement, Engineering, and Education. To successfully address speeding, all three of these components must be in place. The engineering prong of this program is looking for immediate ways to help solve this issue by installing raised lane markers and considering land reductions in some locations.

Consultants have been engaged to conduct a traffic corridor safety study and will make recommendations to promote safer movement along the corridor. There will be public involvement in this process and residents will be given opportunities to provide feedback. Also, part of the plan includes upgrades to several of the traffic signals along the Ferguson Road corridor.

Streetlights are owned and operated by Oncor.

Options are being explored as to how the City and Oncor can work together to upgrade the concrete foundations in the center medians that have caused at least two fatalities over the past year.

The Dallas Police Department are committed to the enforcement prong of Vision Zero. Since the program began, they have made over 3,000 traffic stops and issued more than 1,700 citations – 200 of which were given to spectators which was made a misdemeanor under the initiative. While responding to 2,500 phone calls the police task force made 65 felony and 400 misdemeanor arrests, impounded more than 300 vehicles, confiscated guns and illegal drugs, and seized 9 stolen cars.








July Volunteer Day Included a Peach of a Discovery

Living Memorials Pilot Program

Hello Neighbors,

Over the last three years, The Friends of the Warren Ferris Cemetery has been restoring the neglected Historic Ferris Cemetery landscape in Forest Hills back to its original eco-system supporting the wildlife as a means of honoring the Dallas pioneers buried there because of our neighborhood!

In the spirit of Warren Ferris, the first to survey Dallas County and a naturalist, FWFC has proposed The Constellation of Living Memorials Pilot Program to honor other neglected or abandoned historic cemeteries in North Texas by restoring native landscapes to support and enhance local wildlife and expand migratory corridors. We will be working with the Dallas Pioneers Association Cemetery Committee to identify six historic, neglected cemeteries in the Dallas or adjacent counties for "rewilding", with native, rather than invasive species.

Upon success restoring native habitats in these parklike locations, we would like to extend our campaign nationwide.

A study by Trinity Prairie Company shows that native landscapes are less expensive to maintain and more self-sufficient during periods of drought. We know that a healthy native ecosystem with wildflowers and native grasses can be very attractive, and safer for memorial statues, plaques and gravestones which are more likely to be damaged by mowers, weed eaters and fertilizers. The property was a bit of an eyesore when the Robys bought it back in 2016. Undeterred by the way the lot tilted toward one of the neighborhood's only remaining run off gulches, Frank envisioned transforming the 60's one story into contemporary home that tucked in beside this wild patch of Forest Hills.

They enlisted a gifted landscape architect, knowing no mere garden artist could handle the job. Form follows function in the design of the angled drive through which spans the width of the property and de-emphasizes the slope of the yard. Extended foundation beds and a new courtyard entryway foreshorten the distance between the house and the street repeating the hard-scaping materials used in the drive. At the corner of the house, the land has been built up to accommodate a cozy conversation pit that overlooks the wild gulch.

Frank and Linda have settled on some great plant choices along the way. Their Salvias, lavender Rose of Sharon and wispy Desert Willows in the courtyard have been blooming their hearts out all summer long. Untrimmed Zoysia grasses flourish in their distressed raised planting box. Japanese Maples anchor the base of the driveway and a weeping Atlas Cedar brings a craggy civility to the foot of the wild gulch.

The Robys can now sit back and enjoy the fruits of their labor. Surprisingly, their "low maintenance" landscape still requires a good bit of tending, but they're happy to work outdoors and feel lucky to have found Forest Hills. "It's a joy to be in the neighborhood." For the neighbors, it's been a pleasure to seem them bring their project to fruition.



August 2022 Marvel Kiewit 8114 San Leandro Drive


Marvel's front yard is a welcomed site this hot scorching summer. Her massive Caladium plantings drape the landscape in cool refreshing tones. A magnificent yellow Shrimp Plant thrives in an old urn at the corner of the house and her Angel Wing Begonias float fire engine blooms that seem impervious to the heat. At 90, Marvel moves carefully around the yard as she inspects the garden's state of affairs. The multicolored inpatients that were so beautiful a month ago, are succumbing and quietly receding beneath the caladium canopy. She wishes her Star Gazer Lilly bed in her side yard was still in bloom, "it was gorgeous!" and stops to admire her Oak leaf Hydrangea bushes which were planted over 25 years ago.

The potted geraniums along her walkway are also tried & true repeaters. "I keep them going from year to year... they have the most beautiful fuscia colored flowers." The potted Sago Palm by her front steps is another favorite. She thought she had lost it a couple of winters back and is thrilled by its revival. This year she'll move it onto the porch where she can more easily cover it in a winter storm.

Marvel is quick to give credit where she thinks credit is due, "The nod goes to Mario" she exclaims. He landscapes her beds twice a year, bringing along whatever he wants to plant that season. "I let him do whatever he wants." With his help she's been able to care for her yard the way her husband and sons always did. "I've been here 55 years! And as long as I live here and have money in the bank, I'm going to keep the garden going. It's my joy!"
