

### Storm Drain Reminder

Please do your part to keep our Forest Hills streets clean and our storm drains clear of debris. It is up to the homeowner to ensure that debris such as leaves, grass clippings, litter, etc. that could possibly wash down the city storm drain is clear from streets. In the past when debris has built up and blocked the storm water sewer, it caused severe flooding in parts of our neighborhood on several streets including San Leandro, San Cristobal, Eustis and Whittier.

  and stone were power washed, the area was
  weeded, roses were trimmed, and much needed mulch was added. Solar lights to light up the
  sign were kindly donated by Monica Lehnen.

- Dallas city conducted tree trimming on all Forest Hills/Breezewood/San Rafael medians, trimming primarily for clearance issues (conducted from the ground only). City subcontracted the work to the Good Earth Company.
- Summer 2022: Sprinklers turned on
- An application was submitted to the Dallas MowMentum program for interior canopy work, structural integrity, and removal of dead trees

in process with the plan to begin cleanup in the near future

IMPORTANT REQUEST: We realize that there are many avid, even certified master gardeners and naturalists within our neighborhood, and as such there understandably is a great interest in what we do with and how we maintain the Breezewood sign area, Whittier Triangle, and the San Raphael median area. But please refrain from taking matters into your own hands by removing any living plants (other than identifiable weeds - weeding is always appreciated!) or trimming of the flowers and plants. Someone in October cut down the roses at the Breezewood sign which seems to be in a spirit of maintenance but it has now left them open to disease due to the ill-timing of the pruning. Please be patient as we implement our maintenance plans.

## **Trash Reminders and Updates**

In an effort by the city to optimize recycling and garbage routes, **Beginning Monday, December 5th, our Weekly Trash and Recycling Collection Day will move from Fridays to Mondays.** 

As a reminder, Bulky Trash can be placed out starting the Thursday preceding the second Monday of the Month. We print these dates on the front page of each newsletter. We also place Bulky Pick-up Reminders throughout the neighborhood on the Thursday when bulky trash can be set out. If you would like to volunteer to place a sign near your home to help remind your fellow neighbors of the date (and to help them avoid code compliance violations by placing trash out at the incorrect time), please email kellykemp@att.net.

## **Fall Monarch Migration**

The Monarchs arrived to our neighborhood beginning their fall migration south with a first sighting in the cemetery on October 2nd, and we are now in their peak migration. If you still have Mexican Milkweed growing in your garden (food and nursery for Monarch eggs and larvae) PLEASE cut it to the ground NOW. It encourages monarchs to break their reproductive diapause and stop migrating, thus contribut-

ing to their decline. This means they will stop to eat and reproduce, which results in the early death of the adults and the eggs because they will not survive winter. The milkweed will then regrow in the Spring as an important food source to the butterflies on their way back from Mexico in time for reproduction during Spring and Summer.

## **ANIMAL ALERT!**

It is holiday season once again and the busiest time of year for veterinary clinics. So, to keep your furry family members safe and out of harm's way follow these simple rules...

Food: It is fun to feed our pets table scraps; however, turkey bones, side dishes and desserts should be for human consumption only. Corncobs are especially dangerous for dogs. Not only are they toxic, but they can be a choking hazard as they are not digestible which can lead to bowel obstruction.

Also, anything containing xylitol can be deadly. Dogs especially like to go through purses and bags to find gum and other commonly encountered products that may contain xylitol such as, sugar-free foods, peanut butter, candy, pudding, ice cream, energy bars, protein powder, chewable or gummy vitamins/medications, and/or liquid prescription medications.

Decorations and Plants: Place all floral arrangements and other decorations out of sight from curious dogs and cats. Poinsettias, holly and mistletoe can all cause irritation, vomiting and/or diarrea. Lilies are especially toxic for cats causing fatal kidney failure.

 Pine cones or needles from Christmas trees can create a blockage or perforate the intestines of pets if eaten.

Christmas Trees: Ensure your Christmas tree is safely and properly secured as falling trees can cause injures to pets.

Place delicate tree ornaments high enough where curious noses cannot reach them. Some decorations look extra edible to our furry friends and can lead to upset stomachs and blockages. Always keep a close eye on your pet while they sniff around the

Christmas tree and make sure candles are out of the way of any pets.




