The Prickly Pear Pantry

Long time Forest Hills resident Mike Carley says his jelly and cocktail syrup company, The Prickly Pear Pantry, began with a biologist visit to the family's Archer County Ranch in 2016. The biologist pointed out that they had a large number of prickly pear cactuses and recommended some control strategies. Having a long-standing desire to utilize wild, natural resources, Mike began to consider what options existed to turn this liability into an asset. After several years of experimentation on his family, he began to produce prickly pear jelly and later cocktail syrup and pancake syrup. They were all a big hit with the Carley family and their friends.

In 2020, during COVID lockdowns, Mike decided to produce the products for sale to consumers. It is truly a family venture. Sam Carley, the youngest Carley and at the time 13 years old, designed The Prickly Pear Pantry logo. Mike and Sam pick the prickly pear fruit, or tunas as they are sometimes called, by hand during the months of September through November. It is a dangerous venture as the prickly pears have many small prickles and getting stabbed by them happens throughout the picking process all the way through the processing.

They then extract the juice from the fruit with a medieval looking machine and use that juice to make their products. They are excited to offer their products for sale through their website thepricklypearpantry.com where they offer free pickup of their products for Forest



Hills neighbors. They also sell their products through Etsy, Amazon, and Ebay, just search for The Prickly Pear Pantry and you'll find them.

Recently, they have had their products sold locally at the Cottonwood Mall and at Maker's Connect. They have especially enjoyed showcasing their products at the Forest Hills Holiday Bazaar, where Janine convinced Mike that tasting the cocktail syrup in margaritas would be a good way to show everyone how tasty the cocktail syrup was! The Prickly Pear Pantry products are truly "Farm to Table". And with Cinco de Mayo around the corner, now is the time to buy a jar of their cocktail syrup with a free recipe for their famous Prickly Pear Margaritas!

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FOOD FOR THOUGHT:

An Opportunity to Make a Difference

Christophe, my husband, arranged this platter for our traditional bagels and lox Christmas brunch. I laughed at the unexpected placement of the sticker he had pulled from his stocking a few hours earlier and taken as a hint that he should change his diet and lose weight. But, the sticker says something completely different to me. It means we have choices when we eat, and they affect you, animals, and our environment.

- We can choose to eat fast food, and we will be supporting an industry that promotes cruelty to animals, obesity, waste, and litter – The speed at which chickens are processed on the slaughter line has doubled since 1979, from 70 birds per minute to 140 today. ¹
- We can choose to eat fish and shellfish and encourage the depletion of our oceans of marine life and likely pollute our bodies with mercury and toxins High demand for seafood drives overexploitation and environmental degradation, eroding the marine food web.²
- We can buy lettuce in plastic clamshells and increase the proliferation of plastic – Plastic isn't recyclable – unlike metal, glass, and paper – meaning it can't be recycled over and over and takes more energy to recycle it than to make it new. ³
- We can buy cream cheese in a paper box instead of a plastic tub – Consumers can put pressure on companies to stop filling store shelves with single-use plastics by not buying them and instead choosing reusables and products in better packaging.⁴



 We can throw away the leftovers – The average U.S. household wastes a third of the food it buys, and food waste is responsible for twice as many greenhouse emissions as commercial aviation.

Every choice we make when we eat has a consequence. Thinking about what we buy and consume doesn't have to take the pleasure out of eating but could, instead, make it a more precious and deliberate experience.

In 2023, conserve your body, the planet, and all creatures by making conscious choices about how you eat.



FHSP + Alley = Faster EMS Response Times

Drive through Forest Hills at night, and you will find dark alleys with poorly marked house numbers. For this reason, ENP Coordinator, Sgt. Mike Mata, recently suggested that our neighborhood install reflective address signs in our alleys. The FHSP Board unanimously voted to fund the expense for these signs. These TxDOT approved signs are 16"x8", and made of rust-resistant, black metal with reflective numbers. This makes them easy to spot and enables ALL emergency services to locate addresses quickly from the alley. As of early February, The Bob Squad & Carol have installed or handed out 161 signs.

ANIMAL ALERT!

With spring upon us and taking our dogs out more, it is time to be reminded how to be a good pet parent and set everyone up for success:

- 1. ALWAYS keep your dog on a leash. Not only is it the law, but it is for everyone's safety, as well. Most dogs are intimidated when they are on leash and another dog is off. You never know how other dogs on leash will respond with a curious dog walking right up to them. A leash also protects the animal from the unexpected. *Be extra careful when using retractable leashes, especially if you have a dog that pulls...these leashes have a tendency to snap.
- 2. Out of respect for other pet parents and their pet, ALWAYS ask if it is ok for your dog to meet another dog. Yes, I know, your pup may be friendly but every dog is different especially in new situations and environments.
- 3. Scoop the poop! Dog feces carry bacteria and parasites and can be passed onto other dogs if sniffed, touched or ingested. And please dispose of it in your own garbage can.


