

one of the first homes built in the yet to be named Forest Hills neighborhood. Some of the streets had been built, but not the whole neighborhood. Current neighbor Rick Reeves said before the main house was built, the Quarters were used as a "Fish House" and a place to stay. Rick's pump house was also a Fish House. There were several fish cabins along the ridge and some of them were owned by H.L. Hunt. There were no houses fronting Garland Road/ State Hwy 78 (then Bankhead Highway/Hwy 1 1917-1926) at the time, so it was a straight shot from San Fernando down to White Rock Lake.

The new owners would ride their horses over from Junius Heights to gather at the lake with their buddies on the weekend and drink whiskey, play poker and go fishing. Between the driveway and the Reeve's house there is a buried concrete tub that served as a live well for the fish they caught.

When the house was finally built, automobiles were the new thing. Now going to the country in 1923, six miles from downtown was easier with a different kind of horsepower.

1954-1980 second owners, Mr. and Mrs. Nemec were both musicians. She played the piano and he the clarinet. In the evening you could often hear their music wafting through the neighborhood. Dr. Wilson's daughter previously had kept horses in stables on the property. John Nemec and his sister, who lived here as children in the 50's confirmed that there were horse stables on the property when their family moved in.

Between 1980-2004, a major renovation was done by the third owners and extensive landscaping took place incorporating a three-season garden to be used as owner's training ground to become a landscape architect.

In 2014, Ron Balentine and Julie Dunn breathed more life into the home with another major restoration. The foundation was re-built, where they found evidence of the original foundation, which was made of a Bois d'arc tree. The kitchen was taken down to the studs and re-built. Extensive electrical and HVAC work was done between the main house and the expanded Fish house. The original wood floors and walls were refinished.

The "knob and tube" wiring in the living room and 23 stained glass windows, beautiful crown molding and original ironwork by historic Potter Art Metal Studios of Dallas remain.

Now a sixth family has taken possession of this historical treasure filled with memories. Welcome Jacob and Ashley Moss!

Approaching its 100th year in April, Forest Hills will be looking back through the years and saluting our older homes built in the 20s, 30s, and 40s, which are also celebrating their milestone years.

Another home steeped in history is this San Fernando Way house known to many as the Cox house. It was built in 1940 at the approximate cost of \$35,000 for Dallas steelman, W.T. Cox, owner of the Cox Fence Company. You can still find the fencing throughout Dallas. Cox chain link fences are known for their signature rooster embellishment.

Cox used his San Fernando Way house to develop a new type of steel framework with pipe columns welded to cross I-beams. The walls were constructed 19 inches thick and the pipe column area provided a space for insulation, ducts, and built-in cabinets between the exterior and interior stucco walls.

This Spanish Eclectic home was built with many levels. Each bedroom had a private set of staircases. The central section of the home was the living room and gallery with two wings angling out at 45 degrees on either side. Half the huge central fireplace was in the living room and the other half in the adjoining terraced gallery. Lanai steel-framed glass accordion doors were placed beside the fireplace opening the two rooms to each other if needed. Another bank of these folding doors was placed along the back of the gallery, which could fold opened to bring the outdoors

in. Beautiful hand-made Mexican tile was everywhere on the floors, stairs and painted ones were inlaid into walls inside and out like pieces of art. Wood doors throughout were custom carved with intricate designs and figures.

Cox had iron casement windows with ornamental grills, iron accents and light fixtures installed throughout. A basement beneath a basement was built where a 30-foot Artesian well was dug. The house with its playful curved roof angles meandered over the lot because it is said Cox refused to cut down several big trees.

Cox buit the original 1935 Dallas Sportatorium, using all his steel resources. The legendary wrestling venue was constructed in the shape of an octagon and seated 10,000. In the late 1940s - 1960s it was also home to The Big D Jamboree. Grand Ole Opry entertainers like Johnny Cash and Hank Williams, Sr. performed there. The Rock and Roll of the mid 1950s brought Elvis, Chuck Berry, Ray Charles, Fats Domino and Jerry Lee Lewis. The cost of admission in 1962 was adults, 90¢ and kids 60¢!

The integrity of W.T. Cox's custom home has been beautifully maintained since the 1940's. The only change to the original footprint was an addition of a master bedroom suite, expanded kitchen with family room and a cupola accent nestled in the terra cotta tiled roof.

There have been three residents since 1940 who have updated and cared for this landmark, all respecting Cox's vision. Nick and Katie Cutri are the latest lucky owners!

When Forest Hills was established in 1924, the advertisement in the newspaper read, "Your Home in a Forest." It highlighted the beautiful oak, elm, and pecan trees that grew throughout the neighborhood. One hundred years later, we still understand the value of these trees, not just aesthetically.

The temperature of the air drops as you enter our neighborhood, and the trees increase the values of our homes.

To preserve these things, we have begun the process of establishing an NFO program. This program allows us to establish standard rules to conserve and maintain the urban forest within the boundaries of the overlay.

There will be many questions as we move ahead. To navigate this process, a committee of 10 households will spend the next few months working with the city, educating neighbors and answering questions. It is important for each household to make an informed decision about whether to support this program.



Reducing waste means much more than reducing carbon emissions or meeting sustainability goals; for many of us, it is a moral and spiritual pursuit. We all have the responsibility to serve each other, the Earth, and all living beings in their best interest.

One of my favorite spiritual writers is Richard Rohr, founder of the Center for Action and Contemplation in Albuquerque, New Mexico, and a Franciscan priest. He says, "Everything created is a message about the nature of God." In other words, you know the creator by his creation. From this perspective, there are so many qualities that would come to my mind, but the top three for me would be that our creator loves color, diversity and surprise.

Look around our neighborhood any time of year and this is apparent. As I write this in fall, things that have recently caught my eye and made me pause are the giant shaggy acorns on the sidewalk, the flaming red leaves of the red maple and three squirrels spiraling at breakneck speed down an oak tree.



### Prepare for Spring in Zone 8b: New Hardiness Zone Map Released

Hello fellow garden enthusiasts in Zone 8b. Yes, that's right Zone 8b! The new Hardiness Zone Map is available, and it's changed. Here are some tips to make your garden thrive next spring:

**Plant Perennials:** Choose perennials that are well-suited for our zone and clay soil unless you plan to bring the plant indoors during the winter months. They'll come back year after year, saving you time and effort. And their deep roots will aerate your landscape, assisting with water runoff.

**Prepare the Soil:** Ensure your soil is nutrient-rich by adding organic matter like compost. Well-nourished soil promotes healthy plant growth and vibrant blooms.

**Start Seedlings Indoors Now:** For a head start, consider starting seeds indoors. This is really beneficial for warm season crops like tomatoes and peppers.

**Mulch, Mulch:** Mulching helps retain soil moisture, suppress weeds, and regulate soil temperature. Choose a natural mulch like straw or bark or, "What about those fall leaves?" They are nature's natural mulch. Leave 'em, don't blow em! Ask your gardeners to mulch them into your grass and/or mulching and spreading in your landscape beds, the soil and your plants will thank you!

Water Wisely and check irrigation system: Keep an eye on your garden's water needs. Water before 10 a.m. to reduce evaporation and prevent fungal diseases. More importantly - water when you're awake, not while you sleep. Why? So, you know if your irrigation system is working properly. Most broken pipes and heads go undetected due to sprinklers running prior to the house being awake.

**Prune and Trim:** Remove dead/damaged branches to encourage healthy growth according to the maintenance program of your tree and shrubs. Ensure you're using the proper equipment to make clean cuts, so you don't leave your green babies open to unwanted disease and pests.

**Attract Pollinators:** Invite butterflies, fireflies, moths, hummingbirds and bees to your garden by planting nectar-rich flowers. They play a crucial role in pollination and contribute to a thriving ecosystem.

**Fertilize Thoughtfully:** There are good fertilizers out there, but the best fertilizer for our rich, but difficult clay soil is compost. Laying a 2-3" layer of compost directly on top of the soil is truly all your landscape needs, with the appropriate mulch coverage on top.

Lakewood Brewing Co. is a family-owned brewery in Garland, Texas that has gained popularity for its exceptional and award-winning craft beers. Founded in 2012 by East Dallas residents Wim Bens and his wife Brenda Busch, the brewery has grown from a small operation to a significant player in the Dallas, Texas, national and even global craft beer scene.

Bens, a Belgian-born brewmaster, developed a passion for beer after many childhood trips "back home." As a young SMU graduate, Bens began his quest for the perfect Belgian-style beer in Texas, only to discover the innovative approaches of American craft breweries. Upon moving to East Dallas, Bens found himself in a community full of creative individuals who were invested in giving back to their city. This inspired him to create beers that catered to a broad range of tastes and occasions. Lakewood Brewing takes a diverse and localized approach, offering something for everyone, which has helped them build a loyal following among beer enthusiasts.

Their flagship beer, Temptress Imperial Milk Stout, has won numerous awards, including gold medals at the Great American Beer Festival and World Beer Cup. It's also the top-selling craft milk stout in Texas and serves as the foundation for many of Lakewood's other beers, like the upcoming Pumpkin Spice Latte Temptress and Double Stuffed Temptress. 

# **Keeping Your Furry Friend Warm and Comfortable**

During the winter months we often see our senior companion animals showing signs of joint discomfort due to the cooler temperatures. The good news is there are things we can do to help our animals with osteoarthritis besides the typical non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs. (Osteoarthritis impacts nearly 40% of cats and dogs.)

If you think your pet is suffering from what you think are "normal" signs of aging, you might speak with your vet about Librela for dogs and Solensia for cats. The FDA has recently approved Librela which is a monthly injection for dogs. It has drastically changed the quality of life for one of our dogs.

### Winter pet tips:

If you are cold, your animal is cold.

If you park your car outside, make sure to knock on the hood of your car or honk your horn before starting it. Cats in particular, tend to climb into the engine because it is warm.

Salt and other chemicals used to melt snow and ice can irritate paws. Wipe paws with a damp cloth upon coming inside.

Antifreeze is a deadly poison to our animals and wildlife; they are attracted to its sweet taste. Clean up any antifreeze spills you see.


### **Feeling Holly and Jolly**
