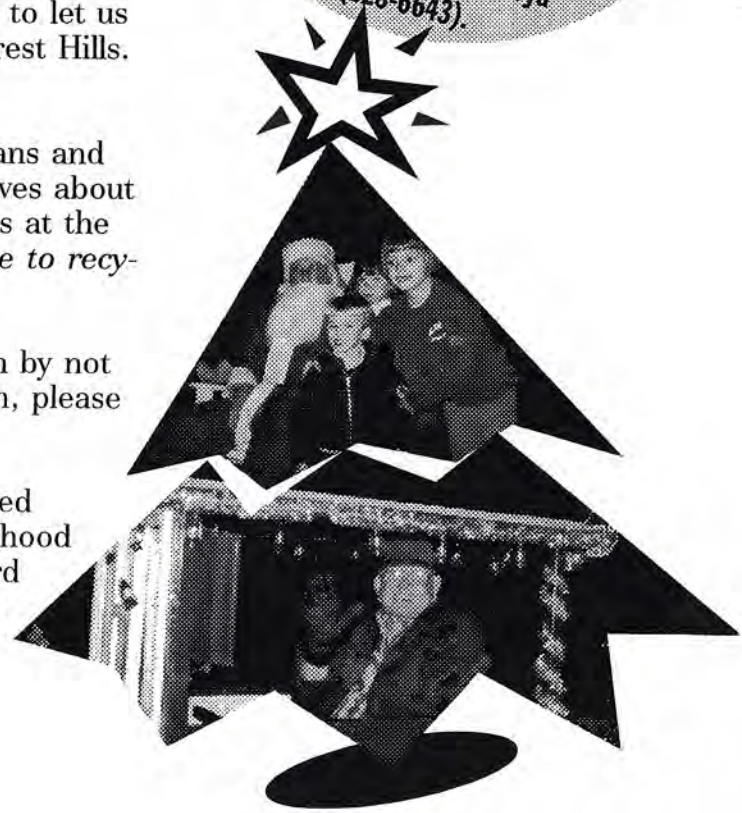
Please help us keep our greenbelts and medians clean by not placing brush and trash on them. When you see trash, please pick it up.

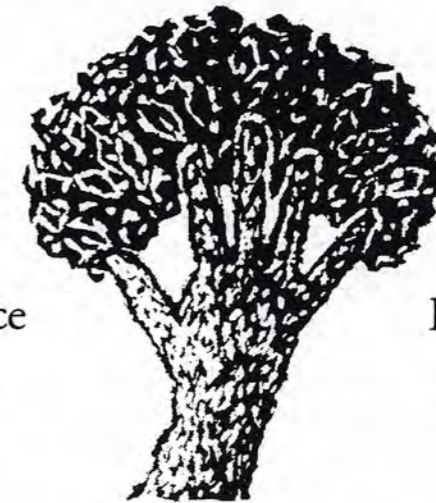

Success for All at Sanger Elementary

Alex Sanger Elementary will adopt a new reading program entitled "Success For All," beginning next year. The program is from Columbia University and is fully integrated. It involves parents in the education process and attempts to eliminate any barriers to learning. Studies have shown that students participating in the program read at least one year above grade level by the time they reach high school.

The program will have an on-site representative from the program to ensure its success. The cost of the program is \$150,000 and Sanger is seeking to obtain a grant from the federal government.

Sanger needs volunteers to read to students to help them improve their comprehension skills. Anyone interested in volunteering may contact the principal, Dr. Larry Allen (319-0260).

Gaston / Garland Road Update

The YMCA of Metropolitan Dallas has purchased the Gaston Bazaar site for its East Dallas Branch. The Bazaar has a lease from the Y to continue operating for the next few months, but sometime during 1999 the new Y facility should be open.

The purchase and building of the new Y was made possible by a challenge grant from former East Dallas resident J.E.R. (Bob) Chilton. He pledged \$500,000 to build a new YMCA if the community could raise an additional \$500,000 and begin construction before the end of 1998. The community and the Y have met his challenge, and construction on the exterior of the building, including a swimming pool, will begin soon.

The YMCA still needs to raise additional funds to complete the project, and all the details are not finalized.

However, there will be a new YMCA that will eventually include more than 35,000 square feet of inside space. The East Dallas Family YMCA will offer programs for our entire community, from child care through the Y's Active Older Adults.

The YMCA has deed restricted the remainder of the adjoining property on Gaston to insure usage that is proper for being next to a YMCA.

Thanks for Leaving the Leaves Due to overwhelming response, the Forest Hills Garden Club is closed



until a later date.

But that doesn't mean you have to bag your leaves and waste landfill space, you can recycle your leaves back to the earth as nature intended by:

- Mowing the leaves into your lawn. It nourishes your soil like a forest floor. Leaves also help protect your beds from freeze damage;
- Building your own compost. Shape 12 ft. x 4 ft. tall chicken wire into a circle. Fasten with clips and stake at the bottom. Put clippings and organic kitchen scraps (not fat) into it. Turning speeds up the compost.
