- * Donate to support our community, such as White Rock Lake and Alex Sanger



Beautification Committee Report



Now that we are coming into spring there are a few things to be attended to.

Just like our own yards, the neighborhood's common areas need a good cleaning, pruning, feeding and mulching to make them look their best for the upcoming year. We are fortunate to have adequate regular maintenance but a little extra attention will go a long way at this time of year.

An area of concern is the uncontrolled growth of bamboo in our park areas at St. Francis and San Benito. We should make the effort to cut a substantial portion of that back before it causes more damage than it already has. This

wooded area has the potential to be very nice with flowering trees and bulbs in the spring and colorful leaves in the fall, but right now you can't see the forest for the bamboo.

We would like to take suggestions for a construction project this year to add definition and recognition somewhere in the neighborhood. One idea I've received is to add Forest Hills in a logo script to the stone wall at Breezewood and Garland. Any other ideas? Let any board member know and we'll make plans to get one done this year. The addition of the National Night Out party last summer was a great success. In think we can inject that same sense of community to the appearance and identity of our common spaces as well.

CITY OF DALLAS SANITATION SERVICES

The City of Dallas Sanitation Services provides REGULAR COLLECTION SERVICE in Forest Hills on Monday and Thursday. RECYCLING COLLECTION SERVICE in Forest Hills is on Monday.

The City of Dallas Sanitation Services provides once-a-month BULKY / BRUSH COLLECTION SERVICE from the front curb that includes large limbs, shrubbery, bagged leaves (in sealed bags with a maximum 50 gallon capacity), furniture, appliances, mattresses and box springs. Please place your items out on the front curb for collection no later than 07:00 A.M. the Monday of your pick-up week. It is also important to remember that items should not be set out for pick up earlier than 07:00 A.M. on the Thursday preceding your collection week

Do not put out for bulky / brush collection bagged grass clippings, new construction or remodeling materials such as lumber or roofing materials. Call 311 or (214) 670-5111 when calling from outside the city limits to get a free estimate on *Cost Plus* service to pick up construction or remodeling materials. Please note that bricks, concrete, rocks, dirt, paint, oil and hazardous containers are not collected in either the Cost Plus or regular bulky / brush collection services.

Every violation for failing to comply with these City of Dallas policies and procedures regarding bulky / brush collection will result in a citation, no warnings, with a fine amount plus court costs totaling \$250.00.

The Forest Hills bulky / brush collection schedule for April and May of 2006 is as follows:

April April 10 - 14, 2006 (Do not set out bulky / brush trash before Thursday, April 06, 2006)

May May 08 - 12, 2006 (Do not set out bulky / brush trash before Thursday, May 04, 2006)

IS THERE A BUILDER'S SIGN IN THE YARD NEXT DOOR?

Is there a new home being built next to your home? Is there a massive remodeling project down the street? Does this builder project to follow?

The answer to all of these questions is **YES**!!! Construction is occurring throughout Forest Hills and each and every one of these projects requires the developer to follow strict policies and procedures.

In October of 2002, the Dallas City Council created the Department of Development Services.

The Department of Development Services is designed to be a helpful and enthusiastic partner, joining residents and developers, in the private development process within the City of Dallas.

The goal of the Department of Development Services is to provide high-quality customer service, while protecting the health, safety and welfare of Dallas residents. Part of that effort involves helping residents and developers understand what is required in the development process, and how to navigate through the various points of reviews and approvals that may be required for a project.

The Department of Development Services has created the City of Dallas Development Guide which addresses as many facets of the development process as possible. The Development Guide includes sections on Business Development, Property Development, Construction Review, Special Review Processes, and Development Coordination in the City of Dallas, as well as directories for business and property development, fee schedules, and an index to codes, ordinances, resolutions, and manuals.


There are rules that builders and developers must follow when working on residential construction projects in Forest Hills. If you believe that these rules are not being followed, you can file a complaint with the City of Dallas by calling 311. If the problem is not addressed and rectified within three (3) business bays, please contact Kevin Rachel, president of the Forest Hills Association, at kevin rachel@msn.com and the FHA will help get the issue resolved as quickly as possible.



crime in District 9 was <u>down</u> 22.4% in 2005 compared to 2004. This is the biggest drop in the city. Yes, there is still too much crime



As most Forest Hills residents are aware, the Ash Creek Trailer Park exists adjacent to Forest Hills, at the intersection of Highland Road and Barbaree Boulevard. This is one (1) of two (2) trailer parks within the City of Dallas.


On July 11, 2005 several Neighborhood Associations, including the Forest Hills Association, filed a Compliance Request for a Non-Conforming Use Application with the City of Dallas Development Services Department's Board of Adjustment. This document (30+ pages in length) contends that the parcel of land occupied by the trailer park does not comply with current City of Dallas zoning, no longer fits within the changing character of our community, has been a chronic nuisance to the community, and has been riddled with continued code compliance violations and criminal activity. Furthermore, the trailer park is not in accordance with the Master Plan for the area which suggests our neighborhood creek areas be turned into beautiful recreational walking, biking, and hiking trails that connect to White Rock Lake and downtown. The document requested a hearing at which time the Board of Adjustment would be asked to order the owner of the property to "cease and desist" operation.

Following an initial hearing in December of 2005, a Final Hearing before the Board of Adjustment ("BOA") occurred on February 15, 2006 regarding the Ash Creek Trailer Park. At this hearing, the BOA ruled that the trailer park must cease and desist operations on November 15, 2006. The owner of the property, who lives in Austin, TX, will most likely appeal this decision.

In the meantime, on Friday, February 02, 2006, the owner of the trailer park filed an application for with the BOA to have the property re-zoned to allow the trailer park to continue operating. A hearing regarding this re-zoning request has been tentatively set for April 20, 2006. More information regarding this hearing will be forthcoming... Watch for signs and flyers throughout Forest Hills... 
YOUR ACTION IS NEEDED!!!

It is critical that residents of Forest Hills that support the discontinuation of the trailer park appear at the BOA Zoning Hearing. Also, it is equally important that you voice your opinion regarding this matter to our public officials, expressing opposition to the re-zoning of the land for use as a trailer park.



Sign Ordinance Enforcement

The city's Code Compliance Department is initiating a new clean-up effort to remove illegal signs across Dallas. Our council offices get calls frequently from citizens who complain about the signs tacked to telephone poles, put in the medians and in the right of






- No signs in the median.
- No signs in the city right of way (ROW). Please remember the city ROW includes the area between the sidewalk and the street as well as all medians and utility poles and boxes.
- No commercial/promotional signs in residential neighborhoods (even on private property).
- No "Garage Sale" signs beyond the ONE sign in the yard of the person having the sale.
- No signs obstructing visibility.

Temporary "Neighborhood Support" signs will be allowed on private property (but not in ROW). These signs include "Neighborhood Association Meeting" reminder, "Bulky Brush Pick-Up Week" reminder, "Crime Watch" alert, "Missing Pet" alert and school events. Political signs can not ever be in the ROW and must always be on private property.

Temporary Closure of White Rock Lake Trail...



The City of Dallas Park and Recreation Department has temporarily closed a section of the trail around White Rock Lake, along the spillway from Garland Road to Winstead Drive. The closure is due to damage caused by heavy rain between March 18 and 20, 2006. This section of trail will remain closed until further notice to allow the area to be assessed and approved safe for use.

Additionally, miscellaneous sections of the White Rock Lake Trail will close periodically to allow park crews to remove mud and debris left from the receding waters. Park and Recreation Department crews have established parking lots and trail clearing as their first priority. Debris removal from shorelines and turf areas will be done as soon as possible.

The Dallas Park and Recreation Department requests the public's cooperation and tolerance during this time of service disruption due to the flood and subsequent cleaning.

Frequently Asked Questions on the Dallas City Government...

2 City of Dallas is governed by a Mayor and a fourteen (14) member cy Council.

The Mayor is the Chief Elected Official and Presiding Officer of the City Government:

- Presides over Council meetings
- Represents the City at official and ceremonial functions
- Creates committees and appoints members, chairs, and co-chairs:
 - o Economic Development & Housing Committee
 - Finance, Audit & Accountability Committee
 - Quality of Life Committee
 - **Public Safety Committee**
 - Transportation & Environment Committee
 - o Trinity River Committee
 - o Legislative (Ad Hoc) Committee
- Appoints advisory committees
- Maintains relationship with other governmental agencies and civic groups
- Makes annual report on the State of the City
- Votes as a member of the City Council

The Mayor and City Council are the Legislative Body for the City:

- Sets policy
- Approves annual budget and plans for capital improvements
- Determines tax rate
- Along with the Mayor appoints City Manager, City Attorney, City Auditor, City Secretary, municipal court judges, and citizen boards and commissions
- Issues and sells municipal bonds
- Purchases and sells property
- **Establishes City departments**
- Holds weekly public meetings
- Approves City ordinances
- **Determines City services**

ALERTS, from the City of Dallas!!!

Dallas Sanitation Services to collect flood damaged objects...

Dallas residents are asked to set out their flood damaged objects or items for free pickup during the next two weeks (from Tuesday, March 21, 2006). The Code Compliance Department will not issue citations during this time period. Dallas Sanitation Services is prepared to respond to the increase of items set out for collections. Sanitation crews will work overtime for the next two weeks to assist Dallas residents with their cleanup efforts. Residents should ONLY set out those items affected by flood damage.

The following guidelines should be followed during the two-week collection period of flood damaged objects:

- Dallas residents are strongly advised to call 311, the City's non-emergency number to report items to be collected...
- Items to be collected should be no larger than an average sofa (6 feet long by 3 feet tall)...
- Damaged items such as carpet, pieces of sheet rock, and flooring materials will also be collected...

Flooding has not adversely affected the Sanitation Services waste collection operations, all routes are on schedule.

Dallas residents with any questions regarding Sanitation Services may call 311 or visit the City's website at http://www.dallascityhall.com. City to begin collecting spring grass clippings...

Dallas residents can dispose of bagged grass clippings March 16 through April 14, 2006 by marking bags with special use tags. The program is designed to aid Dallas residents who scalp their lawns each spring in the disposal of grass clippings. Scalping is a landscaping practice that involves cutting grass very close to the ground.

The tagged collection service was authorized in response to citizen requests for a spring "scalping" collection period. Tags cost \$1.50 each and can be purchased through April 3, 2006, by calling the City's non-emergency number, 311, or logging onto the City's Web Site. http:// www.dallascityhall.com. Charges will appear on water bill statements. Cash purchases can be made at the Sanitation Services Department, 3112 Canton Street, 2nd floor, Monday - Friday, 09:00am - 04:00pm.

Sanitation operations will pick up all tagged bags of grass clippings on regular garbage collection days. Bags of grass clippings without tags will not be picked up. The last collection date for bags of grass clippings is April 14, 2006. The City encourages residents to mulch or com-





Spotlight On....

Doug Kerr, FH Neighbor and Photographer

Doug Kerr has lived in Forest Hills since 1973, when he came to Dallas to take over the presidency of DeVry Institute of Technology at Dallas. In 1978, he left the college to return to his first love, telecommunication engineering. In 1983, he formed his own consulting practice in that field. In more recent times, much of his professional work was in developing and presenting seminars in telecommunication engineering topics, which were given both through the George Washington University in Washington, D.C. and directly to telecommunication firms and government agencies. Today Doug is mostly retired from that work, but is active in a similar "teaching" vein as a volunteer in the area of digital photography, where he has become the "resident wonk" for several online forums where complex technical information in that field is "cussed and discussed".



Earlier in his technical career, Doug had been active in the development of many industry standards in the data communication field, and invented the "caps lock" key now found on almost all computer keyboards. Doug was for a number of years active here with For the Love of the Lake, the volunteer organization devoted to the upkeep and enhancement of White Rock Lake and the surrounding park, and was in effect the organization's "chief engineer".

Doug's wife Carla (they have been married since 1999) is the founding Queen Mum of a local chapter of the Red Hat Society, a social organization for mature women who "just want to have fun". She is an avid quilter, and is at the moment restoring a rare antique wicker trunk. Doug's two daughters and one granddaughter live in the greater Dallas area.

Neighborhood Crime Watch

On March 17, 2006 at about 7:10 am, a Forest Hills resident was driving out from the alleyway at San Cristobal and St. Francis when he was suddenly blocked in by a vehicle on St. Francis. The driver of that vehicle jumped out of the car and ran up to the Forest Hills resident, pointing a handgun at the victim's head. He threatened the victim and told him to give him his wallet. The victim initially tried to back up, but the alley was too narrow. After a brief attempt at resistance the victim handed over his wallet. The thief ran back to his car and fled toward Ferguson Road on St. Francis. The suspect description is:

Black male, 28 - 30 years old, 5' 10" 160lbs, short cut hair, clean shaven, profane speech, wearing a t-shirt and blue jeans. He was armed with a blue steel semi-automatic handgun.
