President's Letter

After three years, this is my final letter as President of the Forest Hills Neighborhood Association. Little did I realize when our neighbor, Tom Deighton, walked across the street many years ago and persuaded me to join the board of directors that this is where it would lead. I didn't really think that I had the time but I just couldn't say "No" to Tom. Since that day, I have discovered new friends and gained a deeper appreciation for our Forest Hills neighborhood. It has been a rewarding experience.

It has been a privilege and honor to serve as your President. In the words of an ancient Chinese proverb, the FHNA organization and the neighborhood has, indeed, experienced "interesting times." There have been a number of crises, some created by mother nature (e.g. snow storms, drought), and some man-made (e.g. alley trash service, Arboretum parking issues). Despite these distractions, the FHNA managed to revamp its organization structure, switch to digital recordkeeping, revise its bylaws, overhaul the website, change its accounting system and create a Facebook page to improve communications. The FHNA is in better shape financially than it has been in ten years. However, a successful organization is known not just for past accomplishments but also for the goals which it is pursuing. The FHNA is currently pursuing monument signs similar to the existing one at Breezewood and Garland Rd. for two other entrances into the neighborhood. There are plans for renewing the plantings on the medians, increasing support for Sanger Elementary to make it a blue ribbon neighborhood school, and a possible children's park on San Pedro. These are worthy goals. Under new leadership, I am confident that the FHNA will accomplish these and many other worthwhile goals as well.

The FHNA President is often presented with competing demands and no easy solutions. For any I may have offended somewhere along the way, I sincerely apologize. I thank our neighborhood block captains. They are the neighborhood's "postmen and women," dutifully delivering the newsletters and other missives, helping keep us connected. Each member of the board of directors, past and present, deserves special thanks for their hard work...and for tolerating my brusque leadership style. Many board members have been contributing to the neighborhood for years, even decades. Without their contributions, no President can hope to accomplish anything. So whatever has been accomplished these past three years was the result of a team effort, block captains and directors, working together. I humbly thank them, and you, for allowing me to be a part of the FHNA team. Best wishes to all our Forest Hills friends and neighbors from Sharon, Laura, Charlie and me. – Leon Russell

Here are some tips to keep your pets happy on Halloween

As much as your dog or cat may beg for some of your Halloween candy, always remember that chocolate is deadly to them in any amount. There's a chemical that naturally occurs in chocolate that they can not tolerate.

If you work in a pet store, remember that this is the time of year that can be deadly for black cats. Some sick people who play at being what they'll call a Satanist will buy them to "sacrifice" If you can, don't take any black cats or sell them during October. Many pet stores won't take them anyway, just for this reason.

The wrappers, such as tin foil, can get stuck in your pets digestive tract and make them ill or cause death. There are plenty of recipes for making home made dog and cat treats, you can always make them on a Halloween theme if you want to make something special for your pet.

Large dogs can have lethal tails when it comes to wagging them. I've seen a German Shepherd that we used to have clear a coffee table in two seconds flat when she got excited. Don't leave any lighted candles or Jack-O-Lanterns where they could be knocked over by a swinging tail or by a curious cat. Not only could your pet start a fire but they could severely burn themselves in the process.

If you are going to dress your pet in a costume, keep in mind that unless the dog or cat is extremely receptive to this kind of thing, you could be causing it discomfort and stress. Some animals don't mind at all but others do not want to be bothered with this kind of thing. They'll be under enough stress with the festivities going on outside and people constantly at the door so don't cause them any more stress then you have to. You may love to dress in costume but then, you aren't a dog or a cat.

If a pet costume comes with a mask, don't use it. While some dogs will love dressing up, they usually aren't too keen on masks. If you do use a mask on your pet, make sure that it's eyes have plenty of room to see and that there is nothing covering it's nose or confining it's mouth.

If you are having a indoor party, make sure that you put your dog or cat in a room where they won't be disturbed. Even if your pet is ultra friendly and doesn't mind loud noises, music and lots of people you should keep them separate for the night. Also, be careful your cat or dog doesn't dart out through the open door as you hand out candy. Best bet is to just put them in a room with some food and water for the night and check on them once in a while to let them know everything is fine.

Tips From A Neighbor

For those who opt for live Christmas trees during the winter holidays, the possibility that water might spill or leak onto the floor beneath is an ever-represent concern. A potential solution already exists elsewhere in your house if you have a hot water tank – the drip pan beneath it! So go to any big box hardware store and buy an appropriately sized, heavy duty plastic drip pan into which your tree stand will fit. There will be a drain hole in the pan. But it can easily be plugged with a PVC fitting (or duct tape if you are less creative). In addition to catching overflow or spilled water, the plastic nature of the pan makes it easy to slide the tree and stand around.

Spotlight on a Neighbor

1. We know you and your husband, Bob, are active in the neighborhood. I remember Bob as one of the first volunteers when we had to clean up the alleys to keep alley garbage pickup. Tell us how long you've lived here and why Forest Hills is special to both of you.

That's correct, Bob was a big help in getting the alley shaped up; he's also the block captain for Highland Road. And so that our neighbors don't think I'm a total slacker, I am extremely allergic to poison ivy and had to demur on joining in since the Highland Road alley was awash with this nemesis plant!

We moved into our home in 1996, a year after we were married. I would cruise the neighborhood (thank goodness we didn't have our crack security team in place then!)looking for available homes. When I saw the "for sale" sign on the lawn we jumped on it and moved in seemingly overnight. We love how the streets are shaded by the neighborhood's "forest," and just as much appreciate the diversity of architecture and the expansive lots. Particularly from our house, we view downtown from our front porch as we toast the setting sun, as well as enjoy dwelling in the woods with its array of furred, feathered, and scaley residents from our back patio--urban and country living at our doorsteps.

2. You're photography is in many galleries and you and Bob were featured artist on the famous White Rock Lake Artists' Studio Tour the weekend of October 13 and 14 in 2011. Give us some insight into your art and a sneak peak at what we can expect to see when we visit your studio during the tour.

Of course, we're still formulating what we will be doing (that's the privilege of being artists [ahem, semi-slackers]), but for my contribution, I have a fun new series I'm calling "Whee!!" that I will introduce along with the series I was just embarking on during the Tour last year entitled "The Sacrifice." My work is based in photography and bound by a narrative or theme. Recently, the photography has morphed into photomontage and has become a more democratic element of a larger whole of mixed media and assemblage.

"Whee!!" is a series of photos taken with a "toy" camera at the abandoned Six Flags in New Orleans--the park was devastated by Katrina and left to ruin, which then became a mecca for photographers and taggers. The quirky thing about the camera is that is almost devoid of controls, so some of my best results were due to my forgetting to manually advance the film. "The Sacrifice" is more complex and I'm afraid I'd lose your readers here if I attempted to explain, but for the intrepid, they could visit my website at sharonocal-laghanshero.com to learn more about it.

Although Bob is more traditional in his photographic approach, his uncanny "oeuvre" and artistic embellishments renders a truly unique body of work. His portfolio can be viewed at silentgimagery.com. Bob is also working on a new series that I'm sworn to secrecy on, so for this new project, along with two additional series of mine that are still in the incubator, you'll have to wait until the 2012 Tour to see if any of these has evolved into art.

We are thrilled to be back on the 2012 White Rock Lake Artists' Studio Tour October 13 & 14 and are really looking forward to it. The Tour is truly one of the best venues in the area for art lovers and a perfect setting for artists to get to know their patrons and make new connections.

3. We understand that in addition to being artists, you also have home-office businesses. Can you elaborate?

Of course! In our by-day, "Clark Kent" guises, Bob is a media planner and negotiator/buyer and I am a graphic designer and writer. We both consider ourselves fortunate to work from our home office and art studio so we can keep an eye on our private micro-forest.


