

More on Forest Hills History









More on the history of Forest Hills, Reconnecting Our Neighborhood to Authentic Sense of Place.

Forest Hills sits on the 640-acre farm that once belonged to Warren Angus Ferris, the first person to survey all of Dallas County when it was wilderness. His family's cemetery is kitty-corner to Alex Sanger Prep School. The Friends of the Warren Ferris Cemetery (FWFC) are dedicated to preserving this remanent historic cemetery, once four acres. In the spirit of Warren Ferris, the FWFC have restored the land to a native wildlife habitat, reflecting what once was, to educate our community about it's cultural and natural history.

Celebrating Warren Angus Ferris Descendant, Christine Cohen...Making Her Dream A Reality

Get ready for goosebumps...Christina has made her dream come true—a podcast about her ancestor, Warren Angus Ferris, is now live. She says, "...cousins cry with joy over this." The first episode emphasizes the "mountain man" aspect and the journal. Part 2 focuses on his life in Texas. You can find it on Spotify: Episode 61 – Warren Angus Ferris – Man of the Mountain Land featured on the Frontier Partisans Podcast.

An eBook is also available about Mr. Ferris' life in the Rocky Mountains: A Diary of Wanderings on the Rivers Missouri, Columbia and Colorado, 1830-1835 by Warren Angus Ferris on Audible Full Version Read for free. Christine found a book through BYU that discusses the early explorers who influenced Brigham Young's decision to seek Zion in Utah. The show American Primeval on Netflix made me wonder if WAF's journal and map had an influence in the decision to pursue the Salt Lake Valley. Christine was right!! This QR code leads to a chapter that talks about Warren Angus Ferris. There are also BYU student master's thesis and PhD dissertations that

The Ferris Cemetery is attracting volunteers from across Dallas to join us in its restoration on the first Saturday of every month. The cemetery is open every day from sunrise to sunset. You are invited to stroll this slice of heaven, a portal that will take you back in time and reconnect you with nature in a native landscape.

These photos capture the latest activities framing this story, from an Eagle Scout establishing a nature library in the cemetery, to families enjoying the great outdoors and learning about nature, while an Alex Sanger Prep school art class engages in learning the techniques of the Hudson River Art Movement within this beautiful setting.



Join us as we celebrate nature's artistry and stroll through White Rock's most beautiful gardens. Each is a delight to the senses, eclectic in design and sanctuary to the gardeners.

This year, three generous, hardworking garden owners from our neighborhood open their gates and welcome people from all over Dallas and North Texas. This is the FHNA fundraiser for beautification of our medians, maintenance of trees and additional plantings. What an easy and delightful way to support our neighborhood's beautification just by attending the Garden Tour.

Three homes plus the Historic Warren A. Ferris Cemetery will be showcased. The cemetery sits right in our neighborhood at the corner of St. Francis and San Leandro and is a hidden gem with historical significance for Dallas, Dallas County and North Texas history. The area is restored with native blooming plants that benefit local and migratory wildlife. Casa Linda Estates and Little Forest Hills are opening their gardens, also, for a total of 10 unique gardens. Each garden will have three artisans plus our Artist Alcove at Casa Linda Park with 10-12 artists displaying and selling their work. Everything from jewelry, sculpture, painting to woodworking. There are favorite artists returning and always new ones to peruse. There is something for everyone, no matter what the style.

The plant sale returns to Casa Linda Park. These plants are curated by the Blue Ribbon Lady, Dione Lineberry, who selects plants suitable for our North Texas weather. It's a popular event: arrive early to shop

for your favorites. Sale opens at 9:00 a.m.

If you attended WREGT 2024, you found food vendors and live music at one garden in each neighborhood. This returns for 2025 at the Forest Hills Blvd. garden.

To care for our environment and reduce plastic on the earth, the tour committee eliminated plastic water bottles and encouraged everyone to bring their water in reusable containers. This is a message that reflects the mission of the Forest Hills Waste Warriors.

The first thing you notice is the large Live Oak tree which is actually two trees. Together they provide a large canopy of shade against the hot Texas sun while mature Crepe Myrtles draw your attention upward to vibrant pink flowers as they tower above the garden. Underneath these trees, rock paths draw you toward the front door and around to the side of the garden, where you will find wide seasonal, landscaped flowerbeds with Redleaf loropetalum, heuchera, pittosporum, yew, Japanese aralia and annual color. Five Japanese maples complete the garden, elegantly flanking the yard.

These wide beds continue past the iconic Adirondack chairs and into a backyard bursting with color

Since Lynda's a fairly new arrival from the Pacific Northwest, diligent research was required as she started her favorite garden style featuring Japanese maples and ornamental dwarf conifers. Like many of us, she lost a mature Elm tree this past winter and is in a transitional period with a new Maple planted. She loves gardening and does her own shopping, digging, planting and tending her beds. After a day's work in the yard, she can rest in iconic Adirondack chairs on her front porch. There is nothing more satisfying to a gardener than observing your plants as they mature and become part of your garden. In the backyard, the porch overlooks their hot tub, more Japanese maples, herbs growing abundantly out of great pots and a vegetable garden. Don't miss the beautiful White Rose of Sharon which is the foundation of a beautiful white garden.

This home is a quintessential Forest Hills Tudor with two large, mature red oaks balanced in the front yard.

A Live Oak planted will develop into a wide canopy for additional shade. Three understory Japanese maples add softness and color. The garden in front displays beautifully crafted seasonal flower beds that are filled with hydrangeas. Pansies are planted in front of the front porch area in the cooler months and white caladiums emerge for warmer months. These plantings have been repeated over the last few years and neighbors all anticipate and appreciate their arrival. This garden knows how to please. The trip down the driveway and into the backyard reflects a family that really enjoys their backyard! An outdoor cooking area, casual dining and relaxing area next to a beautiful pool are the perfect locations to enjoy family and friends. While appreciating this resort-like feeling, notice the seasonal flower beds along the back of the house and down the side fences. A family vegetable area is awaiting new plantings. One reflection from me

Divided We Trash, United We Restore: Coming Together for the 2025 Ferguson Road Litter Pick-Up

"I get into picking up litter," I texted one of our Forest Hills neighbors after the Ferguson Road Initiative's annual litter clean-up event on March 1. "Me too," he answered back. A group of Forest Hillers joined forces with our Enclave and White Rock Hill neighors to tackle Highland Road from San Rafael to Ferguson. We all felt exhilarated afterwards about being outdoors on a beautiful morning and working in solidarity with others to make a difference.

It's gratifying to see this high-traffic artery completely cleared of the usual debris and feel a sense of accomplishment at all the bags of litter we piled up. Of course, all those bags point to the disconnect between our addiction to convenience and consumerism and its effect on our natural world, of which we are a part. When we trash our environment, we rob ourselves of our God-given dignity.

When we come together – especially outside – for a common cause, we start to feel more alive and connected to the world around us. We are paying close attention to the ground when we are picking up litter, we are listening to the wind and birds and we start to merge with our surroundings. It is enlivening.

When we finished, people from Forest Hills, Forest Oaks, Claremont, White Rock Hills and White Rock Montessori met up in St. Francis Park for socializing and refreshments. Meeting new people, getting to know each other and what we care about and sharing food and stories bridges perceived separation – and builds community. I'm convinced it is the solution to creating a safer, more peaceful and engaged world.


Blues & Maples
